Safety Alert!

Spring is here and with the pretty weather, car break-ins always seem to increase. This year, there's been a rash of spare tires disappearing off the back of SUVs as well. These are crimes of opportunity. Take away the temptation and access and each of us is much less likely to become a victim.

- Always lock your car.
- Don't leave valuable items in plain view. Take them with you or lock them in the trunk out of sight.
- Don't keep personal information in your glove box or console.
- Never leave your car running unattended or leave your keys in the car or ignition.



Disc Golf Update by Brian Litke, Wells Branch Resident In October 2012, the Wells Branch MUD authorized the final phase of the expansion of the WB Disc Golf Course from 9 to 18 holes. The new design places all of the course baskets on the south side of WB Pkwy, and players have begun using the new starting point by parking along Owen Tech Blvd.

In 2011, during the initial phase of the redesign, the course was expanded to 18 holes, but final placements for the baskets were postponed while the new layout was tested and fine-tuned to minimize environmental impact and ensure the best use of available land. Feedback was provided by a variety of sources in the community, including a town hall meeting where the MUD heard neighborhood input. In the end, the wisdom of our local residents and board members helped shape a disc golf course that has already enhanced the name of Wells Branch as a community with one of the most pleasant places to play disc golf in Austin.

The course redesign has been popular with players, who enjoy the shade in the forested landscape, the expanded course length, the practice basket at the start of the course, and the safety of not having to cross WB Pkwy. The redesign will be completed in April with the installation of concrete tee pads, signage at each hole, and block stone benches.

It has been said many times that the greenbelt, the trail system, the playground and the lake are gems in the crown jewels of WB, and the disc golf course provides another precious amenity--and another opportunity to get some exercise and see just how beautiful Wells Branch can look. I would like to thank the Wells Branch MUD Board and the many WB residents who participated in the process of patiently providing feedback and shaping the course redesign.

What is disc golf?

Disc golf is a sport similar to golf in which the player throws a plastic disc (smaller than but similar to a frisbee) at a target,

which is usually a pole draped with chains and a basket to catch the disc. Each player counts the number of throws it takes to reach each target and compares the total to the par for the course.

Who plays disc golf?

Disc golf is a sport that is can be enjoyed by anyone, no matter the skill level, and it is inexpensive to play. I see families playing at the WB course, as well as couples, kids, and regular players in their 60s. It's a great way to be active, and you can easily pick up a casual round and perhaps meet a new friend when you arrive at the park-there are a lot of friendly regulars. Many residents such as myself chose Wells Branch due to its greenbelt amenities, including the disc golf course, and I'm sure WB will be even more attractive in the future to residents who have a passion for disc golf.

Disc golf started in the 1960s, and today it is one of the fastest growing sports worldwide, growing at a rate of 12-15 percent annually for more than the past decade, with nearly 3,000 courses in the US and more than 4,000 globally. You can purchase disc golf discs at Academy, Play-it-Again Sports, as well as DiscNation, a store based in Austin (and online) devoted to disc golf.

The grand opening of the redesigned Wells Branch Disc Golf Course will be launched on May 18 from 9am-4pm with a disc golf tournament appropriate for all ages and skill levels.

The redesigned course is now located south of Wells Branch Parkway and parking is available along the street on Owen Tech Blvd., across the street from Whataburger. Each player will receive a custom artwork disc golf disc and reusable water bottle as part of their registration. There will also be raffles, door prizes, and awards for winners of each division.

At the top of each hour, local disc golf players will hold short instructional sessions on disc golf rules and different techniques for gripping the disc and throwing disc golf drives and putts.

Check Your Irrigation System Now: proper maintenance saves both water & money

Irrigation systems need to be checked to make sure they are working properly and efficiently. Faulty systems can greatly increase your water bill and contribute to unhealthy lawns, plants and shrubs. Before the system is activated for the Spring and Summer seasons, here are some

maintenance recommendations for checking your system.

Controller Box

- Clean out cobwebs and dirt
- Check wiring for loose connections
- Change batteries
- Check time and date of watering cycle. Make sure that it is programmed to follow the District's voluntary watering schedule.

Odd Addresses = Saturday & Wednesday
Even Addresses = Sunday & Thursday
Automatic Irrigation Systems = Before 10 AM
Hose-end Sprinklers and Soakers = Before 10AM or
after 7 PM

Remember, the Spring months require less water that the hot Texas summer months.


Sprinkler System

- Before running the system, remove the last sprinkler head in each zone and run the water for a few minutes to flush out any dirt and debris. Replace the head.
- Activate the system and check to make sure that all heads in each zone are spraying consistently. Low pressure could indicate a broken pipe as well as a zone not coming on or turning off prematurely. There should be an even flow of water from each head with no bubbling or spurting.
- Check each head to make sure it is popping up correctly and that it is not leaking or covered with debris. Grass may need to be trimmed to allow the head to operate properly.
- The head should be adjusted to spray on the landscaping, not the street, sidewalk or driveway.
- A monthly check of each sprinkler head should be performed throughout the watering season.
- Adjustments to the watering cycle should be based on changing rainfall and temperatures throughout the year.

New Committees we'd like to get started:

 A "Green Team" to organize and pick up along the trails once a month and possibly coordinate with the Disc Golf Green Team and Keep Wells Branch Beautiful efforts. Members could also volunteer at the quarterly recycling/ repurposing events (Hazardous Waste Collection/Easter Seals/Habitat for Humanity) held in Jan/Apr/Jul/Oct.

- "Neighborhood Deals" whose purpose would be to determine interests and needs of WB residents and negotiate deals at a reduced rate. Like sponsoring a "dead tree removal week" where residents might receive a specific discount if they used a certain vendor during a given time frame encouraging residents to get the work done while saving them money at the same time.

Winning homes would have a sign posted in their yards for a month, be recognized on the WBNA Facebook page, website and in the newsletter. This comes at a time when yards have been devastated by the drought and has the potential to breathe life and renewed pride back into our landscaping (once again, increasing property values). There's a lot of room here to shape this one! Chris Flores has volunteered to chair this committee, but he NEEDS volunteers!



New Teen Focus Group Formed

The purpose of the newly formed Youth Advisory Team (YAT) will be to partner with the WB MUD Board of Directors to develop and improve activities, programs, and amenities for teenagers that reside within the Wells Branch community. This does not, at this time, include designing any facility, i.e. bike park, skate-park, etc. *This isn't saying the skate park is off the table – the Board would just like to start with a comprehensive look at what the WB teens want in the way of amenities and programming."

The following youth will be serving on this team: Zaiah Palmer, Kat Sands, Alyssa Weaver and James Berver.

Preserving the Pond and Native Species Habitat

March 5, the MUD Board voted to remove all feral ducks and geese from Mills Pond in an effort to improve water quality. This decision does not affect migratory waterfowl. The Board sought input from numerous consultants as well as open community forums before arriving at this decision. The ducks will be sedated and captured, then relocated to farms. The board has located a farmer near Bryan, Texas who will take about half of the ducks for breeding purposes. In addition, one of our Wells Branch residents, Betsey Harper, has graciously offered to relocate many of the fowl to her farm in Elgin and a friend will be taking the remainder. Betsey's farm has several tanks where the water quality is strictly monitored. Thank you, Betsey for giving our WB ducks a home.

March 19, the MUD Board voted to implement the proposal by TexaScapes for Phase 1 of the pond improvements. You may view the pond renovation plans on the MUD website.

March 5, the Board elected not to go out for bids on solid waste services. Progressive (IESI) has provided much better service than their predecessor and our solid waste costs are lower than any of the surrounding areas. In addition, they offer single stream recycling for more materials and pay the MUD a premium on recycling collected. At the March 19 meeting, the Board voted to renew the contract with Progressive Waste Solutions of TX, Inc. (formerly IESI) for two years with a 1.6 CPI.

Waters of Willow Run Update

The residents of Well Branch have made an impact. The letter writing blitz had 148 participants and our efforts have gotten the attention of the TDHCA board in a meaningful way.

Regardless of the final outcome, it is clear to see that we can bring the Board of a Department of the State of Texas to doubt their own findings. Thanks to all that helped with this win!

The TDHCA hearing was on February 21, 2013. After several hours of testimony by residents and the applicant for the Waters at Willow Run, the project was conditionally approved for funding subject to six issues being resolved. The questions were all raised by Wells Branch residents who testified: Scott Swain, Emily Berver, Laura Ludwig and Mike Howe. The Board was very generous with their time, listened intently, and asked very informed questions of the WB Residents and the applicant before they made their decision.

WBMA-Is Your Favorite WB Merchant a Member?

You may be wondering why this is important to you as a resident. The answer is simple. We should support all our local merchants and home based businesses because they not only supply us with the goods and services which are close and convenient to our homes, but they also contribute a 1/2% sales tax which helps support the library and ESD in our district.

The Wells Branch Merchants Association (WBMA) needs your help to get all our merchants and residents involved. The WBMA's purpose is to make residents aware of the great businesses right here in Wells Branch and encourage everyone to "Shop Local".

There is absolutely no membership fee for merchants to join and become a vital part of our community. We have one meeting a month for planning and to meet your neighboring merchants.

The outstanding issues that need to be resolved are:

- Determining that the 'tower fall zone' for the high tension power lines and the communication tower are within the utility easement. TDHCA does not allow for a building to be within the fall zone and the current site plan has apartment buildings directly adjacent to the easements.
- 2. Verifying which emergency response agencies will respond for fire, EMS, and police services. Factors to be considered are that property is in the City of Austin, but in Williamson County and outside of the response area of our fire department, Travis County ESD #2. It is known that ESD#2 does NOT respond to the storage facility next door to the property.
- The developer was asked to provide documentation from RRISD that they will provide bus transportation services for Wells Branch Elementary. The site is within the current walk zone for WBE.
- 4. The developer was asked to provide documentation that arrangement for CAP Metro's Ride Share service has been arranged.
- 5. The developer was asked to provide documentation that RRISD is addressing the overcrowding problem at WBE with plans to build an additional elementary school in the neighborhood.
- 6. The TDHCA staff will need to verify that the required minimum of six services is with-in a 1-mile radius of the property is met. They were unable to do that at the hearing.

On March 12, 2013, the Texas Bond Review Board discussed the pending bonds for the Waters at Willow Run. The Review Board also listened intently to our neighborhood's concerns and several members mentioned receiving letters from the community. They decided to postpone making a ruling regarding approval of the bonds until all outstanding issues are resolved.


