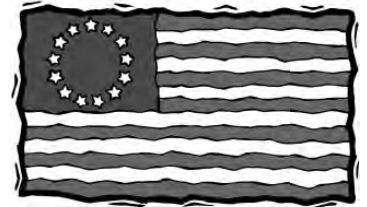
When the parade returns to the Community Center, we kick off a FULL day of events.

Discs Fly at Grand Opening of WB Disc Golf Course by Brian Litke, WB resident

The Wells Branch MUD unveiled the redesigned WB Disc Golf Course with a Grand Opening event on May 18. Ninety players registered for the event and played a round of disc golf for fun, not prizes. The event celebrated the completion of the expansion of the WB disc golf course, which was originally founded as a 9-hole course in 1996 and was under redesign from 2011 through 2013 as it was upgraded to 18 holes.

The finalized course includes concrete tee pads, quarry stone benches, and tee box signage. A course kiosk and a practice basket add to the course amenities, making it not just the most fun disc golf course in Austin, but the best looking. As MUD Board member Bob Bauhs said during course development, "I think we can do it better than everyone else." From the overwhelmingly positive feedback the course has received from players, I believe we have. While the original 9-hole WB course was very short and wide open, the new 18-hole course is located in a wooded area of the greenbelt along Owen-Tech Blvd. south of Wells Branch Pkwy. Many of the holes retain the WB course's short nature; although, several holes have been lengthened and creatively positioned to provide variety and take best advantage of the terrain.

Each player at the Grand Opening received a custom-branded Wells Branch disc, a metal water bottle, and a door prize ticket for their entry fee. I'd like to thank the sponsors: TexaScapes, who donated the water bottles, DiscNation, Branch BBQ, Rack Daddy's, Inka Chicken, All Gods Creatures Grooming, Tejas Liquor, Waterloo Disc Golf Club, Chain Reaction Disc Golf, and Fly Ink Disc Golf. As the designer of the disc golf course, I'd like to thank the

Wells Branch staff who did the actual work to make the course. It looks fantastic! We have a talented crew creating and tending the various amenities in Wells Branch. As Donna Howe said during a town hall meeting about the disc golf course, when WB decides to do something, it's the "Wells Branch way" and that means high quality. I'm proud to live in WB where residents like myself can take an idea before the Board for consideration. It's the type of direct local government access

that is the envy of people in bigger cities where it is so much harder for an individual voice to be heard. Thank you to MUD Board members Donna, Janet, Tom, Bob, and Joe; former board member Chuck Walters; district manager Shirley Ross; and Richard Fadal of TexasScapes for supporting the improvements throughout the WB greenbelt.

With the course finalized, my role as the course designer changes. Our course needs monitoring and loving care to keep it looking good. To organize support for the course, earlier this year local golfers formed a Wells Branch Disc Golf Club, and 60% of club membership fees from its 115 members are allocated towards tree planting and mulching at the disc golf course. The club purchased four trees in March, and volunteers spread mulch around trees at the course in March and May.

If you haven't had a chance to come out to the disc golf course, please stop by. The WB course is very approachable for beginning players, and I see all varieties of community members at the course: men, women, couples, teens, and families. All you need is a disc to play, and you can purchase discs at stores such as Academy, Play-it-Again Sports, or DiscNation.com.

Fireworks Reminders:

These restrictions remain in effect at ALL times even if the County is not enforcing a fireworks or burn ban.



USE OF FIREWORKS ON MUD PROPERTY is prohibited at all times. This includes all MUD facilities, parks, trails, greenbelts, the Pond, drainage detention areas, the veloway, and the grassy area located at Robert I. Walker and Charla Circle. For any questions concerning firework use on district property, please contact the MUD office at 251-9814.

In addition, Texas law prohibits the discharge of fireworks on school district property. The Texas Occupations Code, Chapter 2154, Subchapter F, Section 2154.251 (a) (1), states that a person may not explode or ignite fireworks within 600 feet of any church, a hospital other than a veterinary hospital, an asylum, a licensed child care center, or a public or private primary or secondary school or institution of higher education unless the person receives authorization in writing from that organization.

Regular MUD Board meetings are held the first and third Tuesday of each month at the Community Center on Klattenhoff unless otherwise posted. All residents are invited to attend. Meetings begin at 6:30pm. Agendas are posted the week prior to the meeting at www.wellsbranchmud.com.



Rec. Center Expansion Meeting

At the MUD Board Meeting on June 4, the Board scheduled a planning meeting to gather input from residents regarding the Rec. Center expansion for July 9, 6pm, at the WB Rec. Center, 3000 Shoreline Drive. Please watch the MUD website, marquees, and bandit signs for updates on this important meeting. A survey, to be completed by mail or online, was also scheduled to be sent out to residents. Please make sure to voice your opinions by survey and/or in person at the meeting on July 9.

Mills Pond Water Quality

Water quality sampling of Mills Pond continues. The most

recent lab results show a general improvement from the first samples taken. Accumulating a series of sample results will provide a broader base for comparison and show how water quality varies over time and in reaction to rain events. The remaining samples are scheduled every two weeks. Reports on water quality can be found in the board packets (posted to the website) for the meetings occurring on the third Tuesday of each month.

Dog Parks Re-Open

Wells Branch off-leash areas have reopened after a two-month closure following an incident at the Bratton Lane park. New rules have been posted, the gate has been replaced (nice job guys) and an extra fenced area inside the entrance has been added for safety.

A WB Tradition: Celebrating the Fourth of July in Wells Branch by Donna Howe



The Fourth of July is a big day in Wells Branch. A parade through the neighborhood, complete with a fire truck, home-spun patriotic floats, kids on bikes, Scouts and other groups marching while a sea of neighbors cheer them on from yards decorated in Red, White and Blue begins the daylong celebration at the park, pool, and Community Center, ending with our

wonderful Wells Branch Fireworks.

How did this tradition begin? It all started back in 1992. After a hard fought battle to try and decide our neighborhood's direction, the MUD Board agreed to build a Community Center. Designs were looked at, style chosen, and money saved for the work. It was the first big project by the Board after the original Park Master Plan and lots of lessons were learned. Slowly the building came together, and the Wells Branch Neighborhood Association tossed around the idea of having a celebration that year on the Fourth of July. But the building wasn't done, and there were doubts as to whether we could pull off a Fireworks Show.

So like all great harvests, this seed just had to germinate a little longer, and get the right fertilized mix of "can-do" attitudes together to try again the next year.

July 4, 1993 was a Sunday; it was thought that a parade couldn't be held on a Sunday morning, so our first 4th Fest was celebrated on the 3rd! Richard Tieken, then Vice President of the WBNA, and Secretary Tom Albin, the person

behind the original idea, gladly took on the task of pulling all the ideas together along with the help of MANY volunteers! The whole neighborhood pitched in and together, did an amazing job.

The MUD Board was busy with the finishing touches on the Community Center. Plaques and cakes were ordered, invitations to dignitaries sent, and PA systems set up. On July 3rd, after a parade of neighbors much like today's (only smaller) and notable for having a Kazoo contingent, speeches were made thanking everyone, and folks were invited to tour the new building and have cake.

Next came the pool party and later, an afternoon meal set out by neighbors at the Homestead. In the early evening there was music by the Austin Lounge Lizards along with dancing on the patio between the Community Center and office as we all waited for dusk and the FIREWORKS!

Some of you now live where the first Fourth of July Fireworks were launched on July 3, 1993. The far side of Wells Port, where Bescott and Rose Pavonia are now, was once a large empty field. The fireworks were amazing; bursts of red, white and blue with big yellow Chrysanthemum designs. Some were even the difficult (in 1993) to achieve purple and green ones. And they lasted almost a full 20 minutes!

Many names of volunteers are missing, but enough can't be said for the great job Richard Tieken did on organizing the first Fourth and the persistence of Tom Albin in believing it could be done. And while each year brings changes and new traditions, I've never celebrated America's Independence anywhere else since that first year. See you at the park!

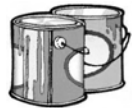

Relocated WB Duck & Goose Update

As most of you know, I have adopted all the Mills Pond geese and the last two roundups of the Muscovy ducks. For all of those who have inquired, this is an update on their health in their new home.

All the geese are doing well, are healthy, and have gained weight. Baby G is happy to be with his parents; and his uncle, named Fred, has picked a mate, Wilma, and spends his day protecting her and her nest. Wilma has had two goslings hatch (Pebbles and Bam Bam), and she is still sitting on her nest, waiting for a couple more which should be hatching soon. In total, we have had 9 goslings born this spring. Most of the geese have finished laying eggs for the season and are spending mornings and evenings swimming in gaggles (groups) in the ponds. During the heat of the day, they stay in the shade, surrounded by chickens, guineas, turkeys, ducks, and the other geese nibbling on grains and greens, or napping.



We all loved to treat our waterfowl at Mills Pond, but most of the human foods fed to Muscovy ducks compromised their health. The rule of thumb is anything we call junk food or a "treat" for a human is not good for ducks. Ducks' systems are very different than ours and can't rebound quickly like we can from a sugary unbalanced diet. Most of the Muscovy ducks adopted were unhealthy eaters, significantly underweight, and several had deformities and illnesses.

As you have seen before the relocation effort, many of the ducks suffer from Angel wing. This is caused by overfeeding ducks too much processed sugar and carbohydrates at young ages. Waterfowl should never be fed bread, popcorn, or other human junk food. As birds grow, the wrist joints become stunted in their development relative to the rest of the wing. The result is a wrist which is twisted outwards and the duck is unable to fly, with feathers that are out of alignment resulting in wings at odd angles.

Several others suffer from Aspergillosis, which occurs when ducks inhale spores produced by the mold that grows on bread, corn, damp straw, or other feed. These inhaled spores cause multiple nodules or plaques in the lungs and air sacs.

And lastly, most of the ducks were suffering from Avian Cholera or fowl cholera and all the Mills Pond fowl have been treated with antibiotics as a precautionary measure. This disease is associated with poor sanitation and standing water. Some of the symptoms included loss of appetite, mucous discharge from the mouth, runny eyes, diarrhea, and labored breathing, and was especially noticeable in several male ducks. I found white lesions and "crispy" livers in the three birds that passed away.

Teaching the ducks to eat a healthy diet of various grains, supplemented with fresh vegetables, fruit, and other table scraps along with cottage cheese and hard boiled eggs, has been a

real challenge, but we've made great progress. My five year old son, Cole, aka the little duck whisperer, has created a special bond with the Muscovies and they seem to think he is their leader. He hand-feeds them nutritional supplements, gives them clean water several times a day with the help of his grandfather, and has been a tremendous help acclimating them, including his occasional "trip and fall" into the big pond.



Although the Mills Pond geese fell in line with the routine, the Muscovy ducks weren't used to the elaborate housing like my own fowl. They are all free roaming, swim during the day, and rest in the trees, but countless times I have been spooked by the ducks in trees and grass in the darkness.

Finally, most have learned to follow the others back from the ponds and high grass areas at dusk, into their covered pens to keep them safe from night predators. And like us, a good night's sleep is crucial in their health and longevity.

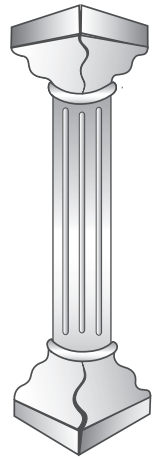
