Early voting is now taking place for the Round Rock ISD and Pflugerville ISD bond elections. It is *IMPERATIVE* that you take the time to vote, whether this week or on Saturday, May 10.

We can't stress enough the need for **EVERYONE** in **WB** to get out and **VOTE**! We're especially fortunate in this election in that we have two mobile voting stations coming to Wells Branch between now and May 10 for Travis County!

Sunday, May 4, 4-6pm • The Conservatory at Wells Branch, 14320 Tandem Blvd.

Early voting is also available close to home at the Travis County Tax Office, 15822 Foothill Farms Loop in Pflugerville. Hours are Monday-Saturday 7am-7pm and Sunday noon-6pm through Tuesday, May 6.

Election Day, May 10, we'll have the Rec. Center & Northwest Elementary as our polling locations from 7am-7pm.

Please note: The Community Center and Library are **NOT** polling locations for this election. You must vote in the county in which you are registered, but you can vote at any location in that county.

The Pflugerville ISD bond package, totaling \$287 million, provides new instructional space for current capacity issues as well as future growth, addresses aging campuses and infrastructure, increases safety and security and provides technology for students and teachers.

Because Northwest Elementary is almost 30 years old, \$2,497,875 worth of improvements have been proposed in the follow areas: Security, Technology, Campus Priorities, Roofing, Electrical, Plumbing. Projected improvements for Westview Middle School total \$1,007,017 and Connally High School is in need of \$9,320,217 in maintenance, improvements and renovation.

Neighborhood Watch Alert-IMPORTANT!

Monday April 28th, a neighbor on Gaylord Drive was outside in the front yard when a FedEx truck (red and blue colored letters) made a stop next to her home. After the Courier delivered the package at her neighbor's home by placing it on the front porch (the recipients weren't home) and drove away, a small white four door vehicle pulled up and a white male got out, ran up to this home and took the package.

The witness felt that this didn't seem right so as the vehicle went down the street and turned around she took a picture with her cell phone and got the license plate number. This happened around 11:50am. She relayed this story to MUD Board Director, Tom Cheshire later in the day.

Tom called the neighbor (intended recipient) and gave her the details. Needless to say, no one was supposed to get this delivery for her. The Travis County Sheriff's Department was contacted through the non-emergency number and a report was started. Without the quick thinking of the witness to get the license plate number, this would never be solved. The picture she took is additional evidence for the case.

There may be others in the 78728 zip that could be potential victims as this thief was following the FedEx delivery vehicle.

If you were supposed to have a delivery this past week and didn't get your package, use your tracking number to check its status with FedEx. Tom has already alerted FedEx to this situation and advised them that their may be more victims. A UPS package was stolen from a WB porch yesterday afternoon as well. The TCSO is aware of this. This is an active investigation and no arrests have been made (YET) as of publication time. The vehicle license plate number was CSS 5654. TCSO has identified this person and his location. If you saw this four door white Mazda on your street after a FedEx or UPS truck was in your area, check with neighbors to see if they got their package. If not, have them check the tracking number with FedEx Express or UPS. If you or your neighbor did not receive your/their package, call 512-974-0845 #3 and get a report started. Then notify FedEx or UPS.

MUD, HOA, POA, WBNA — WTH? Somebody tell me the difference, PLEASE!!! by Debby Thompson, President, WBNA with contributions by Chuck Walters, ACC Chair and former President, Wells Branch MUD Board of Directors and Dan Ernst, Stoneridge POA Board

If you've ever felt this way, this article is for you. Most of us in Wells Branch (except Bratton Glen, Bratton Hill, and Brattonwood) are a part of the Wells Branch MUD (also referred to as being In-District). If you live in Wells Branch, and pay your water bill to Wells Branch Municipal Utility District (MUD), you're in a MUD. You may also be in an HOA or POA. And, in addition to these, we'd really like to have you in the WBNA.

Are you confused yet?

Wells Branch MUD - The Wells Branch Municipal Utility District (MUD) is a recognized local government created under Texas State Law providing for these limited authority entities as part of the Water Code.

Wells Branch MUD provides for creation and management of services supporting water, wastewater, drainage, parks, safety, solid waste and other functions. The Wells Branch MUD Board of Directors are elected to four year terms at elections every two years (for 2 or 3 members per election).

WB MUD was created in 1981 by a group of developers that were expanding neighborhoods around Austin. WB is NOT a part of the city of Austin, but we are in the ETJ (extra-territorial jurisdiction) of Austin. For this reason, we are served by the Travis County Sheriff's Office and ESD#2 instead of City of Austin Police or Fire Dept. We do not pay taxes to the "City"; we pay taxes to the MUD and County for their services.

The mission statement of Wells Branch MUD is as follows: "The District works in a cost effective and efficient way to support the vision by monitoring, tracking, and ensuring quality of life in the District. Quality of life has been defined as safe water supply, well maintained amenities, recreational opportunities, general safety, and stable and appreciating property values."

HOA/POA (Home Owners Association/Property Owners Association) – Generally speaking, an HOA/POA is a membership of property owners that is responsible for the enforcement of the Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions for the properties in their immediate subdivision. There are some exceptions for "In-District" vs. "Out-of-District". Many of the Associations also maintain the landscaping and fences in the common areas of, once again, their immediate neighborhood. The goal of an HOA/POA is to enhance the appearance of its neighborhood and maintain property values. Dues paid to an HOA/POA, go for Covenant or Deed Restriction enforcement and maintenance of the common areas of the subdivision.

Each Association retains a property management company to collect dues and maintain the accounting and expenses for the Association.

If you are "In-District", the WB MUD handles your covenant enforcement. Some HOAs/POAs carry out Deed Restriction enforcement in addition to the Covenant Restrictions documented by the MUD.

"Out-of-District" HOAs/POAs are responsible for enforcement of violations of the Covenants and Deed Restrictions.

There are six HOAs or POAs in Wells Branch. If you live in Bratton Glen, Bratton Hill, Brattonwood, Brookside, Stoneridge or The Lake at Wells Branch, you live in an area with an HOA or POA. There is a link to each of these HOAs/POAs along with property management information on our website: www.wbna.us under "Links".

If your home is in one of these areas, membership in your designated HOA/POA is not optional and was disclosed during the purchase of your property. You became a member of your HOA/POA at the closing of your home purchase when you signed a "Planned Unit Development Rider" which explains the terms of the HOA/POA and your responsibility for payment of dues. You could not close on your property without signing this document.

Each HOA/POA has its own specific guidelines as to how many Board of Director positions are elected and the term of these positions although most offices are elected annually at a general meeting of Home/Property Owners. Board of Directors and Officers serve on a voluntary basis; they donate their time and efforts to the neighborhood.

The WB Architectural Control Committee (ACC) is an independent (non-MUD) group that must be contacted for home and property alterations prior to modifications for "In-District" properties. "Out-of-District" properties have their own Architectural Control Committees that may be contacted through their property management companies.

WBNA - Wells Branch Neighborhood Association - The Wells Branch Neighborhood Association is a social/civic organization that includes all addresses in Wells Branch whether "In-District" or "Out-of-District". We are NOT a governing body and do not collect taxes. We have no legal right to enforce anything. Membership dues, \$20 per year per household, are optional, but GREATLY appreciated. The WBNA publishes the **Neighborhood News** six times a year. Each issue is hand delivered to every house in Wells Branch, all 3,366, by volunteers. In addition to this, we put on the Easter Egg Hunt each year, hold a Silent Auction fundraiser during FourthFest, host National Night Out for the neighborhood, and host the Friday night activities during Luminary Fest in December. WBNA also hosts several meetings throughout the year featuring a variety of topics including safety, candidate forums, school bonds, and housing projects. Our website, WBNA.us posts neighborhood events, news, and information resources. We also maintain a Facebook page with photos from just about every WB event for the last several years. We encourage everyone to "Like" our page to receive updates and reminders on events in Wells Branch. The WBNA relies on dues, donations and advertising to fund our endeavors with the purpose of keeping the residents of Wells Branch informed and facilitating community spirit. We have a board consisting of six officers who are elected each January by a majority of WBNA members. We are strictly a volunteer-run organization.

In short:

WB MUD: Most of Wells Branch - Taxing entity with responsibility to provide services to residents. Provides a safe water supply and maintains an excellent park system that adds to our property values. Recreational opportunities and events sponsored by the MUD are outstanding!

HOA/POA: Some parts of WB - Collects dues for covenant (Out-of District, only) and deed restriction enforcement and property maintenance.

WBNA: All of Wells Branch - Voluntary membership to fund neighborhood activities and foster a sense of community. Hopefully, we've helped to clear a little confusion. Bottom line is: All are separate entities with entirely different purposes, functions and funding. We can, however, communicate with each other and join together for events to create a stronger community.





Northwest Elementary News By Betsey Harper



I spend many of my free hours at the school with teachers, staff, and students. It amazes me every spring just how much our kids develop over one year, let alone from kindergarten to fifth grade. Did you know that our teachers

and staff help your kids' development not just by books and planned lessons, but by the language of encouragement too?

Most parents enjoy praising their children with phrases like "Great job!" and "That looks amazing!" But research shows that **encouragement** has a bigger effect than **praise** on a child's motivation. So what is the difference?

Praise:

- Discusses results. "Great job on the quiz! You got an A!"
- Uses opinion words such as good, great, terrific.....
- Is typically given when your child has performed as you had hoped he or she would.

Encouragement:

- Notices effort and progress. "Look at that project, I can tell you've spent a lot of time on it! It must feel good to know you worked so hard!"
- Uses descriptive words. "You cleaned your room without being asked. Look at that clean floor and organized desk!"
- Can be given regardless of your child's performance. "That didn't work out the way you planned, did it? I can tell you are disappointed, but I know you'll try again next week. What do you think you might do differently next time?"

The big difference is that words of praise lead your child to rely on YOUR assessment of their accomplishments, while words of encouragement lead them to form THEIR OWN positive assessment of *THEMSELVES*. Encouragement makes motivation soar! Try it and notice the difference.

Wells Branch Architectural Control Committee Submitted by Chuck Walters, Chairperson, ACC

The Wells Branch Architectural Control Committee (ACC) helps to maintain the value of the homes and property in the various neighborhood sections by reviewing improvements or modifications the owners wish to make to their property and assisting to be sure the requested changes are in compliance with the covenants (deed restrictions) that were agreed to with the purchase of the property and home during the closing process.

The covenants were created with the neighborhood by the original developers of each section. They provide the requirements on how the properties should be maintained to support a consistent design and standards. The covenants can be modified by owners by following the specific guidelines in the documentation and gaining the certified notarized approval of the owners in that section. The ACC and WB MUD must be notified in advance so any change has a smooth transition for the reviews by ACC and enforcement by WB MUD.

The WB ACC does not provide enforcement of the covenants. The WB MUD and HOAs (for those within an HOA) provide this function to help keep the property values from deteriorating and support the tax base to provide the services and maintenance of infrastructure and facilities. The WB MUD does not have the authority to create or change the covenant.

The WB ACC provides the review of requested changes to assist owners in adherence to these rules. Keeping a uniform collective environment helps to maintain the value in our investments for all property owners. Other neighborhoods have become 'run down' and lost value due to poor compliance and enforcement in those areas. Please do your part to support our standards to maintain our values and to keep Wells Branch beautiful.

The WB MUD facilitates the processing of requests and maintenance of the decisions to support the proper enforcement and records of properties with approved changes. The WB MUD maintains the covenant documents for each section; these can be found by selecting the section your home is located in on the interactive map at http://wellsbranchmud.com/general_information/covenants-map.html. All requests should be submitted to WB MUD for processing. There is an overview on the MUD web site under the Services menu tab with additional information on the process.

The Wells Branch Architectural Control Committee has been supporting our neighborhood from the days the developers completed the build out of various phases. A great thank you and appreciation goes to Mike Howe as Chairperson and various committee members over time who have provided this voluntary critical support to Wells Branch Municipal Utility District neighborhoods. The Committee is now transitioned to a new team effective April 1, 2014 to continue to provide this important service for the property owners.

The new members are Chuck Walters, Chairperson; Emily Berver, Member; David Lotspeich, Member. Submit requests and the committee will review them on an individual basis. The submissions should continue to be sent to the WB MUD that facilitates the processing of documentation.

The ACC is forming a 'Green Committee' to help develop guidelines for xeriscaping, rainwater collection, solar panels, metal roofing for structural changes and other green initiatives that will be in line with the covenants. We are looking for interested parties to assist in these efforts. Babies, Babies, everywhere...Relocated Mills Pond Waterfowl Update By Betsey Harper

What a wild spring it's been! We are entering into the hatching season when momma chickens, ducks, geese and guineas start to strut their new born kin around the ranch.

So far this year, the geese have blossomed into great protectors of all fowl, not just their own. Baby G and GG have had 2 new goslings which hatched last week; one is a cross breed like Baby G with a lighter beak and the other has the darker dominate Chinese Goose traits except for the light color-



ing at end of her bill (see pic). While they are still small and not old enough to get into too much trouble, both parents are keeping close watch over them and defend them against all things. Within the last week or so, the goslings have doubled in size (and cuteness) and have started to develop their goose down, first feathers, and personalities. It won't be much longer and they will be off swimming, digging, chasing, and doing all things goose-related.

Our Angel duck, is sitting on a nest full of eggs (duck, guinea, turkey, and chicken eggs) with her little malformed wings spread over them for warmth and protection. Remember, Angel was the momma duck captured with a couple ducklings last year with wings that looked twisted backwards (she has extreme angel wing from a previously high carb or bread diet). She is the nicest, sweetest, smallest Muscovy duck and the best mother and protector of her mixed off-spring.

It's time for me to take a walk, check the grounds, and label nests and eggs again. Most ducks don't care where they lay their eggs like Angel - they're not so fastidious about it, my Mills Pond Runners especially, since they rarely go broody. These ducks will drop their eggs wherever - they're all over the place. Sometimes they'll have a favorite spot where most of the eggs are laid one week, but it's always moving around. And, yes, I tried the golf ball thing; I tried building them special nest boxes - which they would sometimes use for a week or two, before laying them someplace else again. Now, I've given up and I go hunting for the eggs in the mornings and check the ponds in the evenings. It's a wild thing, but better on a protected ranch than in our Wells Branch yards.

WB Eastside Butterfly Garden By Betsey Harper

Two years ago, four neighborhood girls, Sarah, Faith, & Grace Ward and Tessi Harper, from American Heritage Girls Troop TX0240, approached the MUD asking for space to create a Wells Branch Butterfly Garden with the help of Master Naturalist Shelley Palmer. I don't think any of us expected these four young girls (with the help of two younger brothers) to create such a special place. The girls researched butterfly habitats, nectar and host plants, and everything a butterfly needs so they could develop something special for our neighborhood.

With the Parks Master Plan in review by the MUD, the girls are very hopeful this will be added as a natural attraction and visited by families in years to come. Our Wells Branch Eastside Butterfly Garden has already been certified as a Monarch Way Station, North American Butterfly Association's Butterfly Garden and Habitat, Texas Bee Friendly, and as a Texas Parks and Wildlife Certified Backyard Wildlife Habitat.

Drowning is Fast & Silent-Keep Kids Within

Arms' Reach By Alissa Magrum, Colin's Hope Executive Director

It's May. And in Texas, May means backyard barbeques, pool parties and summer just around the corner. May also means National Water Safety Month and an opportunity to tell parents that **DROWNING** is the number 1 cause of accidental death for children under 5, yet it is **PREVENTABLE!** Last year, more than 82 Texas children lost their lives due to drowning.

When my daughter Ella was 3, I didn't worry about drowning. She took swim lessons. We loved the pool, the lake and the beach. We spent long hot summer days keeping cool in the water. I worried about bike accidents and falls from the monkey bars. Then, 4 year old Colin Holst drowned in a busy public pool with lifeguards on duty and family and friends close by. My daughter went to preschool with Colin. Thankfully, Colin's family turned their tragedy into triumph and formed Colin's Hope to raise water safety awareness to prevent children from drowning. Colin's Hope has accomplished so much already but the work is far from being done because children are still drowning quickly and silently in bath tubs, pools, open water, toilets and even buckets..

Water is NOT safe. Water will never be completely safe BUT there are simple things you can do and small behavior changes you can make that can help your family to be safeR around water. Read on and invest a few minutes of your time. Think about it -- we take 20 seconds every time we get in the car to buckle our babies into car seats to keep them safeR. We spend countless minutes reminding our kid to put a helmet on before they pedal off to keep them safeR on bikes and scooters. We do these small behaviors over and over because we know they can help prevent tragedies. Why wouldn't you also add layers of protection to prevent a water related accident?

Below are 10 simple things you can do NOW that will add water safety tools to your parenting toolbox (and to your pool bag) and help prevent your children from drowning.

- 1. Take and share the Colin's Hope water safety quiz at http://www.colinshope.org/quiz/, it could save a life!
- 2. **Talk to your kids about water safety** and tell them to NEVER get into water without an adult Water Guardian (that's YOU or another adult).
- 3. Understand that **DROWNING** is FAST and SILENT.
- 4. Be a Water Guardian. **Keep Kids in Arm's Reach** when near, in and around water.
- 5. Enroll in formal swim lessons and **learn to swim**.
- Ensure that your pool and your neighbors pools are fenced and have self latching/locking gates.
- 7. Weak and non-swimmers should wear an approved and properly fitted life jacket, NOT water wings or floaties.
- 8. Teach kids to **stay away from pool drains** to avoid entrapment.
- 9. Learn CPR.
- 10. Visit www.colinshope.org and learn more.

Please share this life saving water safety information with your friends and family as we prepare for another long, hot Texas summer. Together, we can achieve the vision of a world where children do not drown!


To increase sightings, CREATE A BIRD-FRIENDLY HABITAT

- Provide water year round: A simple birdbath can be very helpful with our minimum rain fall and water restrictions.
 Add new water every 2-3 days in warm weather to prevent mosquito larvae from hatching.
- Plant native plants: Even with environmentally friendly
 park close by, it is still very helpful to provide a variety of
 native plants in your back yard to offer year-round food in
 the form of seeds, berries, and nectar. Evergreen shrubs
 provide excellent cover through all seasons. The Lady Bird
 Johnson Wildflower Center has lists of recommended
 native plants for the Austin area: www.wildflower.org/col-lections
- Remove invasive plants from your yard: Many invasive plants out-compete with the native species favored by birds, insects and other wildlife.
- Eliminate insecticides in your yard: Insects are the primary source of food for many bird species and are an important source of protein and fats for growing juvenile birds.

Library Box Project Earns Eagle Rank

Community member Trey Black, now an Eagle Scout with Troop 8787, led an Eagle project earlier this year to install and stock 12 library boxes throughout WB. The library boxes are a source of free reading material for neighbors and the culmination of 250 hours of work contributed by 24 volunteers and led by Mr. Black. When asked about his motivation for the project, Trey responded, "As a homeschooler, education and literacy have always been important to me and I wanted a project that was more than just manual labor. It was also a priority to do something that benefitted our neighborhood." So when you see one of the library boxes around the neighborhood, take a book or leave one that you think someone else might enjoy.

Trey's scouting career began at age six as a Tiger cub. He advanced through cub scouts earning his Webelos Super Achiever award and his Arrow of Light. In Boy Scouts, Trey has earned over 50 merit badges, his Den Chief Service Award, he's been inducted into the Order of the Arrow (OA - Scouting's honor society), earned the Vigil Honor for continued service and dedication, and has now earned his Eagle rank. Trey has held numerous leadership positions at the troop and OA lodge level, including his current position of Vice Chief of Inductions where he coordinates events of up to 600 people. Through scouting's high adventure program Trey has ridden horseback through the mountains of New Mexico, canoed the back country of Canada, gone scuba diving in the Florida Keys, trekked to the bottom of the Grand Canyon three times, and has spent well over 100 nights in the back country. In addition to the fun, Trey has contributed hundreds of service hours through scouting.

In the fall Trey will be attending the Engineering Honors Program at the University of Texas at Austin. Prior to that he will be an intern this summer at the Applied Research Labs at UT and will also be spending nine days at NASA running experiments on a Reduced Gravity Aircraft (the Vomit Comet!) as a member of the Austin Community College Microgravity Team.

Trey would like to thank all of the families who are hosting the library boxes, the many people who dedicated time and resources to the Eagle project, and the many adult volunteers who make the scouting program possible. He would also like to thank all of the Wells Branch neighbors who bought popcorn from him over the years!
