# **Silent Auction Items Still Needed!**


Each year, the WBNA hosts a Silent Auction during the FourthFest celebration on July 4th.

# Plan Ahead for Fireworks Safety from Travis County ESD No. 2 - Pflugerville Fire Dept.

If you choose to light personal fireworks this holiday, please remember that you must get permission from the property owner – even if it's a commercial property not in use at nighttime.

Remember that fireworks are NOT legal to use on or around schools and Travis County parks. They're also not legal on Wells Branch Municipal Utility District (MUD) property, which includes all MUD facilities, parks, trails, greenbelts, Mills Pond, drainage detention areas, the veloway, and the grassy area located at Robert I. Walker and Charla Circle.

But if you choose to light fireworks in a safe, legal location, Travis County ESD No. 2 (Pflugerville Fire Dept.) wants you to better understand the dangers of fireworks and work together as a family to stay safe. Rather than risking your safety with personal fireworks, we strongly recommend checking out a professional fireworks show. A great option in this area is the 4th Fest in Wells Branch!

# Here are other safety tips for your family:

## **Respect Vets and Pets**

• Please respect your neighbors if you choose to light fireworks. This year, July 4th falls on a weeknight when many families will be working the next day. Keep in mind that the sound of fireworks can be very stressful for some veterans and others who experience Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). It also scares many dogs and other pets.

# **Make Fireworks a Family Activity**


- Before the holiday, make a point to discuss fireworks safety with everyone in your family to decrease the chance of someone getting hurt.
- Never let children purchase fireworks without parents there—even older kids.
- Insist on adult supervision whenever fireworks are being lit—even for older kids. Children age 10 to 14 years old actually get the second-most number of fireworks burns and injuries, right behind preschoolers and toddlers!
- Kids who are younger than kindergarten-age should never be allowed to hold any fireworks on their own, **including sparklers**. Sparklers reach temperatures of 1,200 degrees, which is hot enough to melt metal. Give little kids glow-sticks instead. Pass the sparklers to much older kids and adults to carefully light ONE at a time—ideally wearing gloves.

### **Preparing to Light Fireworks**

- Only light fireworks OUTSIDE on a flat surface that's far from any homes or buildings. Don't light fireworks near dry grass or leaves—you can catch them on fire.
- Before you light a firework, take a good look around to be sure there aren't any people or pets in range of possibly getting hurt.
- Don't lean over firework devices or place your hand over them when lighting.
   Immediately back up as far as you can after lighting! The body parts that suffer the most fireworks injuries are fingers, hands, eyes, face, and ears.

### **Safely Disposing of Fireworks**

- Don't try to re-light fireworks that didn't work on the first try! Leave them alone, then thoroughly soak them in water with a bucket or hose before you try to handle them
- Double-wrap ALL fireworks in plastic before throwing them in the trash. The same is true for a firework you find sitting on the ground that looks like it's been used. It may still be active and could re-ignite in your hand or pocket.
- Fireworks are poisonous to pets. Symptoms may include vomiting, a painful abdomen, and bloody diarrhea. Be sure not to leave behind any used fireworks where pets (yours or someone else's) spend time.

The Travis County Tax Office asked St. Andrew's to help host a Civic Engagement Fair on September 1. We were happy to say yes! Bruce Elfant's friendly Tax Office registers voters, trains and certifies Volunteer Deputy Registrars (VDRs), and provides information to help citizens participate in our democracy. Through their tireless work, in April 2018 voter registration levels in Travis County reached a record 90% of eligible voters.

Because of the MUD, WBNA, Library, schools, recreation opportunities, plus our many great churches and businesses, Wells Branch achieves a high level of civic engagement. Neighbors help neighbors and recognize the importance of connecting with local leadership to both maintain and improve Wells Branch. St. Andrew's is proud to be part of such an active and caring community.

At the Civic Engagement Fair, St. Andrew's will host representatives of our Tax Office, community leadership groups of all types, voting empowerment organizations, and other helpful folks to provide information and further encourage civic participation.

Attendees can find out about current voting requirements, so everyone knows how to get their voices heard at the ballot box in the 2018 General Election on November 6. Also, registrars will be available to register eligible voters.

St. Andrew's is looking forward to celebrating the Wells Branch community and helping our Travis County leaders foster civic participation. The health of our democracy begins in every neighborhood, as we connect with each other and recognize what amazing things we can achieve working together!

# 2018 WB MUD Board of Directors Election

The Wells Branch Municipal Utility District (MUD) is a recognized local government created under Texas State Law providing for these limited authority entities as part of the Water Code. Wells Branch MUD provides for creation and management of services supporting water, wastewater, drainage, parks, safety, solid waste and other functions.

Wells Branch MUD Board Directors are elected to four year terms every two years (for 2 or 3 members per election). MUD Board of Director elections are held on the uniform election date in November of every even-numbered year. In 2018, the election will be held on Tuesday, November 6. Three of the five Director positions are up for election this year: Places 1, 3, and 5, currently held by Howard Hagemann, Betsey Harper, and Shelley Palmer, respectively. The start date to file an application for a place on the ballot for the 2018 Director election is 8:00am on July 21, 2018. The deadline to file for a place on the ballot for the 2018 Director election is 5:00pm on August 20, 2018. # Mr. PC's Computer Corner by Dave DeVore

With the popularity of DNA test kits increasing into an estimated \$99 million a year business, it's time to ask "What could possibly go wrong?" before you do a cheek swab. Actually, quite few things that have already happened and many more that could happen well into the future. It was revealed recently that the Israel based MyHeritage website was hacked last October, a breach that netted the hackers 92 million email addresses and passwords. The company claims no DNA data was compromised since their authentication server was separate from the system that houses the digital DNA files. Disturbing to me is that it took nearly 8 months for the company to notify the public of this problem, plenty of time for mischief such as identity theft, phishing attacks, etc. to have taken place since the break in. From a computer security perspective, the usual steps to protect yourself should be followed. If you used MyHeritage, change your password right away. Use different strong passwords for each website you frequent. If you have a lot of them, use a password manager program such as Roboform or LastPass to help you generate and fill in these complex passwords securely. Make sure you have good, up-to-date virus and malware protection on each of your devices, including smartphones, and run detection scans regularly.

Equally disturbing is what will happen when the next exploit of a DNA testing company also gets the bad guys access to DNA information. Could you or someone in your family tree be connected to an unsolved crime, as the Golden State Killer was in April? Could you be blackmailed because of some dark genetic secret that you wouldn't want revealed to the world? Might DNA testing become a routine requirement for health insurance, with the possibility that coverage could be denied based on the proclivity of someone with your DNA characteristics for developing certain health conditions like cancer or heart disease or perhaps a tendency for addictions or depression? Besides those with ill intent, civil libertarians are alarmed at the different ways that DNA databases could be tapped by law enforcement or other governmental units to find familial matches and narrow their searches for suspects down. I'm afraid this is a topic that will only grow in importance over time. It's a brave new world!

# Martins in the Meadow by Karen Hagemann

Been by the North Meadow lately? Noticed all the bird activity?

Our wells Branch Purple Martin colony is thriving. With the help of Howard Hagemann, our bird advocate on the Board, Wells Branch MUD added a third rack of martin gourds to the meadow this year. The martins arrived around the end of February and soon started nests in all three racks of gourds. The volunteer martin stewards spent hours monitoring the gourds to remove invading sparrows and keeping an eye on our birds. The martins have been busily building nests, laying eggs and feeding newly hatched baby martins. A count in mid-May showed 144 eggs in nests.

Purple martins are migratory, and visit Wells Branch each spring to nest and raise their young. Martins nest in cavities and rely on people to provide suitable nest spaces. Native Americans began hanging hollow gourds specifically to attract purple martins because the birds consume so many insects. Recent research indicates purple martins eat the queens of invasive fire ants, potentially impacting the spread of these invasive insects.

Purple martins build their nests with a foundation of twigs and mud, a layer of smaller twigs and sturdy grasses, and a final layer of leaves in which the eggs are laid. The martins also use green leaves as a cover for the eggs. A typical nest has three to six eggs. The eggs incubate for sixteen days before tiny, almost featherless birds emerge. The adult birds both feed the chicks. At twenty-eight days, the new martins begin to try out their wings. The adult birds assist the babies and monitor their early flights to prevent the little ones from venturing too far too soon. Early morning and evening hours are the best time to see the martins in flight.

As nesting season draws to a close, purple martins begin to congregate in large flocks each night to feed and rest before beginning their annual trip to South America for the winter. Our WB martins will join hundreds of thousands of martins in the vicinity of Highland Mall. The annual roost is an

amazing event to watch. Travis County Audubon Society hosts Purple Martin Parties and provides volunteers who will answer questions for the curious. Check their web page at https://travisaudubon.org/purple-martin-parties for updates about the days and location.





# 4th of July - Work Toward Your Own Financial Independence Day submitted by Nicole Viator, Financial Advisor

We're getting close to the Fourth of July, our national Independence Day. This celebration may get you thinking of the many freedoms you enjoy, but have you thought of what you might need to do to attain financial freedom?

Your first step is to define what financial independence signifies to you. For many people, it means being able to retire when they want to, and to enjoy a comfortable retirement lifestyle. So, if this is your vision as well, consider taking these steps:

Pay yourself first. If you wait until you have some extra money "lying around" before you invest for retirement, you may never get around to doing it. Instead, pay yourself first. This actually is not that hard to do, especially if you have a 401(k) or other employer-sponsored retirement plan, because your contributions are taken directly from your paycheck, before you even have the chance to spend the money. You can set up a similar arrangement with an IRA by having automatic contributions taken directly from your checking or savings account.

**Invest appropriately.** Your investment decisions should be guided by your time horizon, risk tolerance and retirement goals. If you deviate from these guideposts – for instance, by taking on either too much or too little risk – you may end up making decisions that aren't right for you and that may set you back as you pursue your financial independence.

**Avoid financial "potholes."** The road to financial liberty will always be marked with potholes you should avoid. One such pothole is debt – the higher your debt burden, the less you can invest for your retirement. It's not always easy to lower your debt load, but do the best you can to live within your means. A second pothole comes in the form of large, unexpected short-term costs, such as a major home or auto repair or a medical bill not fully covered by insurance. To avoid dipping into your long-term investments to pay for these short-term costs, try to build an emergency fund containing six months' to a year's worth of living expenses, with the money kept in a liquid, low-risk account.

**Give yourself some wiggle room.** If you decide that to achieve financial independence, you must retire at 62 or you must buy a vacation home by the beach, you may feel disappointed if you fall short of these goals. But if you're prepared to accept some flexibility in your plans – perhaps you can work until 65 or just rent a vacation home for the summer – you may be able to earn a different, but still acceptable, financial freedom. And by working a couple of extra years or paying less for your vacation home expenses, you may also improve your overall financial picture.

Putting these and other moves to work can help you keep moving toward your important goals. When you eventually reach your own "Financial Independence Day," it may not warrant a fireworks display – but it should certainly add some sparkle to your life.



# Wells Branch Community Library District Celebrates 20th Anniversary

The Wells Branch Community Library District was formed August 8, 1998, after months of hard work by Wells Branch residents to collect the signatures required to put the creation of a library district on the ballot. The library opened to the public a few weeks later, on September 12, 1998—out of a closet in the Wells Branch Methodist Church. Open just a few days a week, the library was made up entirely of donations from the community and nearby libraries and was run by volunteers.

Needing more space to grow, the library opened in its own space in Bratton Square on February 20, 1999. It was here that the library first made computers available to the public and launched some of the programs that continue today, like summer reading and our Polar Express Pajamarama. An expanding collection—including audiobooks and a growing collection of movies, first on VHS and later DVDs—meant that the library needed more space than its 2,700 square feet in Bratton Square.

On February 1, 2003, ground was broken on the library's current building on Wells Port Drive. After months of construction, the doors to our new home opened on December 8. Our collection has grown to fill our 16,000 square foot space, with more that 55,000 items on the shelf and thousands more available digitally. Our hours have expanded, too, with the library open seven days a week to serve Wells Branch residents. With concerts, special programs, book clubs, and early literacy activities, the library is as popular as ever, with more than 110,000 visits in 2017.

It's been a pleasure to serve the residents of Wells Branch for the past 20 years, and we look forward to many, many more! To celebrate this milestone, we invite you to join us for treats and fun at a Wells Branch Library Birthday Party on Sunday, August 5 from 2 to 4pm.
