#### Construction of ES No. 34

Construction of ES #34, located at 2800 Sauls Drive, has completed foundation work and is on track for completion by Summer 2016.

### New Principal for ES No. 34 Named

Round Rock ISD named Gabrielle Niño principal of Elementary School No. 34, at the groundbreaking ceremony July 28. Niño has served as the principal of Bluebonnet Elementary School for four years and has been a leader in Round Rock ISD since 2006. ### **Naming Update**

On November 19, 2015, the board-appointed naming committee recommended former mathematics teacher and administrator, Joe Lee Johnson, be selected for ES No. 34. If approved by the Trustees at the December 17 meeting, ES #34 will become the first school in RRISD to be named after an African-American. #### **Boundaries**

THANK YOU to all of the parents from Wells Branch who made time to attend the boundary hearing at WBE on November 10, ask questions, and give input. While no decisions have been made, the District stated that it normally allows fifth graders to finish at their previous school if so desired and for siblings of fifth graders to continue at the original school that year as well.

Preliminary boundary change recommendations may be found at wellsbranchpta.org or wbna.us. The Trustees discussed feedback from these hearings at the November 19 regular meeting and a final recommendation is expected to be presented to the Board of Trustees at the regular board meeting on December 17, 2015 for approval.

### **Targeted Programming for Elementary Schools**

RRISD has requested the WBNA host a meeting in January to discuss the exciting new programs being offered at both Wells Branch Elementary and ES No. 34. The new school's focus has been set as *STEAM* (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, Mathematics). As of publication, WBE's has yet to be determined. Differences in programs offered may affect the ability of parents to choose attendance at a specific school. Updates for this meeting will be listed on the WBNA website and Facebook page.

Carbon monoxide (CO) is a gas. It has no odor. CO gas is poisonous. It can make a person feel sick and can be deadly. In the home, heating and cooking devices that burn fuel can be sources of carbon monoxide.

#### **CO ALARMS**

- CO alarms should be installed outside each sleeping area.
   Install alarms on every level of the home. It is best to use interconnected alarms. When one sounds, all CO alarms in the home sound.
- Follow the instruction on the package to properly install the CO alarm.
- Test CO alarms at least once a month.
- Replace CO alarms according to the instructions on the package.
- Know the sounds the CO alarm makes. It will sound if CO
  is detected. It will make a different sound if the battery is
  low or if it is time to get a new CO alarm.
- If the battery is low, replace it.
- If the CO alarm sounds, you must get fresh air. Move outdoors, by an open window or near an open door. Make sure everyone in the home gets to fresh air. Call the fire department from a fresh air location. Stay there until help arrives.

#### PREVENT CO POISONING

- When warming a vehicle, move it out of the garage. Do not run a fueled engine indoors, even if garage doors are open. Make sure the exhaust pipe of a running vehicle is not blocked. Clear snow away.
- During and after a snowstorm, make sure vents for the dryer, furnace, stove and fireplace are clear of snow build-up.
- Clear all debris from dryer, furnace, stove, and fireplace vents.
- A generator should be used outdoors. Use in a well-ventilated location away from windows, doors, and vent opening.
- Gas or charcoal grills can produce CO. Only use them outside.
- Have heating equipment and chimneys inspected by a professional every year before cold weather sets in.
- Open the damper when using a fireplace for adequate ventilation.
- Never use your oven or stove to heat your home.




### TRAVIS COUNTY BROWN SANTA

### **WB Traffic Updates:**

### **Howard Lane at WB Pkwy**

Travis County expects to begin construction of a traffic light at this intersection in January 2016.

#### WB Pkwy onto Mopac Left Turn Lane Extension

The existing double left turn lanes will be extended back to the Howard Lane intersection to allow for more cars to queue up at the light at MoPac.

### Owen Tech Blvd at WB Pkwy

Travis County plans on marking the pavement for the installation of a traffic light at this intersection within the next week or two and begin construction of the light shortly thereafter.

#### **Bratton at Sauls/Long Vista**

A Traffic Study was done last week. Results are not yet available.

#### **Bratton at Shoreline**

A Traffic Study was done last week. Results are not yet available. In the meantime, bicycle lanes will be restriped at the intersection to allow for right turn lanes.

#### Shoreline/1325

This intersection is controlled by TXDoT. Dedicated right turn lanes have been requested for this intersection.

### Completion of Grand Avenue between MoPac and I35

The portion of Grand Avenue west of Bratton that already exists will be widened to four lanes. Two other sections west of Bratton will be completed within the next two years. Unfortunately, the property owner of the portion closest to Bratton has no immediate plans for develop ment. It's the last piece of the puzzle! Stay tuned for updates.

#### Cadoz Drive Extension

Cadoz Drive will be extended into the development north of Willow Run (Travesia). However, it will not directly intersect with Grand Avenue. Hopefully, this will deter additional traffic a bit while allowing another escape route for Wells Branchers.

### **Town Hill Drive at Merrilltown**

A Traffic Study was done last week. Results are not yet available.

### **Crosswalks on Wells Port**

Travis County agreed to add reflective striping at the crosswalks on Wells Port to increase visibility.

As a Venturing adult advisor, one of the difficult tasks is allowing your crew to experience failure. On the September camp out at Lost Pines Scout Reservation the cooking accessories (pots, spoons, etc.) were left behind. Watching the crew members process the event from finger-pointing ("That



was your fault, not mine!") to seeking rescue ("You'll drive back and get it, won't you?!") to eventual cooperation and problem solving ("Well, how can we make this work?") was a ton of fun. While I wouldn't say failure is a goal for Venturing, I would

say it's a very valuable teaching tool.

In addition to experiencing failure (in the good way), the crew has also been training for a Spring Break backpacking trip in the Grand Canyon. The crew submitted two backcountry hik-



ing itineraries (41 and 31 miles, respectively) to the National Park Service in late October. The backcountry permits are limited in number, so wish the crew luck in garnering one!

Holiday Safety Tips by Debby Thompson, WBNA President & WB Neighborhood Watch Coordinator

With the bustle of the holidays just around the corner, make sure you're taking every precaution possible to keep your home and family safe and secure. We usually see an increase in opportunistic crime this time of year; please remain vigilant.

**Keep your blinds and drapes closed when away,** even if only for a short period of time.

**Keep your house well lit at night (backyard included).** A motion sensor activated light is an inexpensive deterrent.

If your Christmas tree is displayed in front of a window, don't pile the presents around it. Store the gifts in another area away from view when the blinds or drapes are open.

Do NOT put the empty boxes for the new computer, TV, stereo system, etc. on the curb for the trash. Take the time to break down every box and put it inside your trashcan/recycling bin so that it is concealed, even if you have to hold it over to the next week. People start cruising our neighborhood on Sunday afternoons to see what has been put out. The less they know, the better.

Door-to-door solicitations increase tremendously this time of year. Always look out the window or peephole before opening the door or answering a knock. Never open the door all the way, especially if you have a Christmas tree and/or presents in plain view.

While shopping this holiday season, remain aware of your surroundings at all times. If unsure of your safety, ask a store attendant to have security walk you to your car. You can't be too safe. This goes for trips to the grocery store as well. When unloading your car at home after a day of shopping, lock it between trips to and from the car.

Always lock your car. Never leave your car running unattended or leave your keys in the car or ignition. If you usually keep a garage door remote control in your car and don't park it in the garage each and every time you return home, hide the remote or take it inside. Thieves check visors and this gives them instant protected access to your home.

**Don't leave valuables in plain view,** even if your car is locked. Take them in the house or put them in the trunk out of sight **BEFORE** arriving at your destination.

Keep the inside door from your home to the garage LOCKED.

#### If you plan to be away:

Let a neighbor and/or block captain know you'll be out of town and when you'll return. They should have the following: your emergency contact information; contact information for anyone with access to your house (pet sitter, etc.); when they should be expected; what they look like and a description of their vehicle(s).

Let only those who **NEED** to know, know when you are going out of town.

Don't share vacation plans on social media.

**Arrange to have your lawn cared for** if you are going to be away.

**Don't hide keys under doormats** or flowerpots or in similar places.

Put your lights, stereo or TV on timers.

Leave a car in the driveway or ask a neighbor to park in it.

**Don't cancel your paper or mail deliveries;** ask that your neighbor pick them up every day.

**Leave a key with a friend or neighbor;** ask that the house be checked at regular intervals.

Store all your valuables.

Consider asking friends or relatives to live in your home while you are away.

**Ask your neighbor to put trash in your trashcan** and to put it out for collection and away when they put theirs away.

**File a Close Patrol Request.** The filing of this form alerts patrolling officers so that they may pay close attention to one's residence. To do so: Contact the Travis County Sheriff's Office at 854-9721. Ask to make a Close Patrol Request. You will be asked for information on those caring for your home while you're away i.e. make and model of their vehicles, name, description and times they should be at your home.

If you are not already, become a Wells Branch Neighborhood Association member. "Like" us on Facebook for community updates. The more community involvement and connectedness there is, the safer we all will be.

Most of all, be aware of your surroundings and look out for your neighbors. If you see or hear something suspicious, call 911. The Sheriff's Department would much rather answer a false alarm than deal with a tragedy later.

We live in a **GREAT** community **AND** a **SECURE** neighborhood. Let's all do our part to keep it that way. **Here's to a safe and happy holiday season!**

### Birding in Wells Branch by Wanda Holcombe



Skip the Bird Feeders and Plant More Native Plants in Your Yard to Attract and Feed the Birds.....

According to an article on the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center website: http://www.wildflower.org/feature/?id=169 studies show that

birds prefer native plants over bird feeders. "If you plant it, they will come," is an unspoken mantra among Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center staff.

Personally, I have started putting out less bird feed and have planted more native plants that attract birds to our yard, and we live on the trail by the creek where the riparian growth

attracts a lot of birds as well. However I still make my own sugar water for our Hummingbird Feeder and purchase Feed for the Lesser Goldfinch for our own back porch entertainment in order to enjoy them "up close" as they are so beautiful to watch feeding.



I hope you'll find some of the following highlights from the Wildflower Center website helpful for your own yard:

#### Skip the Bird Feeder

- Most North American songbirds, depend on insects present on native plants to feed their young.
- The more diverse the vegetation and the fewer the cats, the more bird species were counted, and...
- Having a bird feeder didn't increase the number or the variety of wild species cataloged.
- The way birds flock at feeders may have a downside, too, as an eye disease in house finches has recently been shown to spread more quickly among birds congregating at feeders.

With winter looming, Horticulturist Sierra DaSilva suggests keeping "deadheads" of dried flowers on stalks for a month or two after seeds ripen adds structural beauty to your land-scape while helping hungry wildlife. "If you plan your space with birds in mind," DaSilva says, "you can easily offer them something for every season."

Declaring November 13 "World Pancreatic Cancer Day" in the Wells Branch Neighborhood.

WHEREAS in 2015, an estimated 48,960 people will be diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in the United States and 40,560 will die from the disease;

WHEREAS pancreatic cancer is one of the deadliest cancers, is currently the fourth leading cause of cancer death in the United States and is projected to become the second by 2020;

WHEREAS pancreatic cancer is the only major cancer with a five-year relative survival rate in the single digits at just seven percent;

WEREAS when symptoms of pancreatic cancer present themselves, it is generally late stage, and 73 percent of pancreatic cancer patients die within the first year of their diagnosis while 93 percent of pancreatic cancer patients die within the first five years;

WHEREAS approximately 2,550 deaths will occur in Texas in 2015;

WHEREAS pancreatic cancer is the 7th most common cause of cancer-related death in men and women across the world;

WHEREAS there will be an estimated 367,000 new pancreatic cancer cases diagnosed globally in 2015;

WHEREAS the good health and well-being of the residents of Wells Branch Neighborhood is enhanced as a direct result of increased awareness about pancreatic cancer and research into the early detection, causes, and effective treatments; therefore be it

RESOLVED that the Wells Branch Neighborhood Association designates November 13 as "World Pancreatic Cancer Day" in the Wells Branch Neighborhood.

### Holiday Trash & Recycling Pickup Schedule Changes

Each year TexaScapes suspends curbside yard waste pickup the week between Christmas and New Years. For 2015 there will be no curbside pickup during the week of December 27 through January 3. Services will resume on Monday, January 4, with extra crew on hand to handle expected Christmas tree disposal. All compostable materials should be placed at curbside by Monday morning. Christmas trees can be placed at curbside or at the east end of the Community Center Parking Lot at KF Park for pickup.

Cooming in January 2016- The WB MUD has contracted with Progressive Waste for *WEEKLY* curbside single-stream recycling. That's right - NO MORE CALENDARS! Recycling pick up will be available EVERY SINGLE WEEK! The additional cost per household of \$1.75 per month will be absorbed by the MUD (yes, it's free, folks). The contract calls for a trial 15-month period beginning January 1, 2016 and ending April 30, 2017. During this time, the MUD will collect data to see if this additional service increases participation and warrants continuation. No excuses now! Please help spread the word and encourage your neighbors to RECYCLE!

### Opportunities to Improve the WB Disc Golf Course by Brian Litke

As a community, it is important to regularly review all neighborhood amenities to ensure their designs are sound and the features are functioning as expected. The Wells Branch disc golf course, established in 1996, was expanded from 9 to 18 targets in 2013. With the new course design now in its third year of use, the WB MUD Board collaborated with the WB Disc Golf Club to review areas where the disc golf course is adjacent to the stream, to identify any areas that are showing unexpected wear, and to implement strategies to replant the worn areas and eliminate future wear along the creek.

The collaboration has been fruitful, and many course adjustments have already been implemented. On November 3, community members gathered to hear about the progress taken, review future improvement strategies, and suggest new ideas for consideration. So far, eight disc golf targets have been moved farther away from the stream. A side benefit of some target moves was the shortening of several fairways, making the course more community-friendly and well-suited to families, couples, and youth. Other inexpensive solutions that are being planned include adjusting tee box locations, selecting new areas to relocate fairways, adding natural fencing as a backstop to a couple of specific areas, and reviewing the course annually to identify new issues that may arise.

With a more sustainable design, players will aim their discs away from the creek, not towards it, and the community can have both an enjoyable amenity and a beautiful stream next to it. The disc golf course, tucked away in the SE corner of Wells Branch, is a beautiful piece of property, even more so with over 40 new trees paid for by the WB Disc Golf Club.

During the review of the disc golf course, the MUD Board noticed an unrelated problem: the trails along the stream in that area are experiencing significant and regular washouts due to drainage issues caused by the impervious cover from the apartments and storage facility that line the west side of the stream. The MUD is investigating drainage infrastructure solutions to reduce erosion and trail washouts caused by rain and flood drainage.

Our park system is a living thing that needs care and nourishing. As stewards of the land, we will always be on the lookout for opportunities to maintain and improve the treasure of Wells Branch, our greenbelt.




