Don't Wait – Check the Date! Replace All Smoke Alarms Every 10 years

National Fire Prevention Week is Oct. 9-15, 2016

Does your home have a smoke alarm/detector? Hopefully the answer is YES. At a minimum, you should have one in every bedroom, as well as the common area just outside of each bedroom, and at least one on each level of your home.


But do you know how OLD your smoke alarms are? If you're like most people, you're probably not sure. Maybe you bought a pre-owned home and assumed that the alarms were updated by the previous homeowners or replaced during the inspection process. You might even assume that your smoke alarms will last pretty much forever as long as they get new batteries. Not true! Sadly, the average American does not realize that smoke alarms are generally not designed to be reliable after about 10 years, *even if* you change the battery every six months and manually test the alarm each month as you should.

A good analogy is a car: even if you keep filling up the gas tank and rotating the tires, if the engine stops working then you'll be stranded. There's a crucial step that most people miss in making sure your smoke alarm will actually work when you really need it: checking the manufacture date that's printed or stamped on the back of the alarm! Time and time again, we see tragedies that could've been prevented if the smoke alarms were working.

National Fire Prevention Week this year is October 9 to 15, 2016. This year's national message from the NFPA is: "Don't Wait - Check the Date! Replace All Smoke Alarms Every 10 Years." Pflugerville firefighters will spread this critical message during community outreach events in September and October, including the WB National Night Out festivities on Oct. 4. We have also been working with the property managers for all apartment complexes to ensure the smoke alarms in each apartment unit are not more than 10 years old.

The bottom line is that you only have two minutes (or less!) to escape a fire before it can kill you. A smoke alarm is literally your BEST chance of surviving a fire at home, especially if the fire starts while you are sleeping. The Pflugerville Fire Department wants to make sure EVERYONE in the entire community is inspired to take your smoke alarms off the wall and check the date of manufacture on the back. If the tiny little stamp or sticker says 2006 or earlier, it's time to get a new smoke alarm right away. Don't wait until it's too late to check that life-saving date!

Voting: Informed & Engaged

You have the ability to shape your world by being informed, involved, and voting. That being said, I urge you **NOT** to vote for the first person who comes to your door, but rather to make the effort to find out all you can about **EACH** of the candidates before making your choices. Keep in mind, local elections tend to have a far greater impact on our day-to-day lives than state or national elections. Wells Branch MUD and Wells Branch Community Library both have candidates on the ballot. These are non-partisan positions so you must scroll all the way to the end to vote in these races.

For state and county elections, the League of Women Voters has an excellent publication that will be available online at http://lwvaustin.org/ mid-October. On the local side, we have bios of all the MUD Board candidates inside this issue (see pages 16, 17 & 22). Wells Branch Community Library will also have candidates on the ballot. Please see page 8 for info on their voting process and brief candidate intros. Detailed bios for both elections may be found on the wbna.us website under the Elections tab.

Read about them. Visit their websites and Facebook pages. They each have contact information available. Reach out and talk to them. Ask questions. Talk to your neighbors and most of all, attend the Candidate Forums hosted by the WBNA. Dates and times to the left of this article.

Questions to keep in mind when visiting with each of the candidates, no matter what position they seek:

- Education & Experience? How will your education, career path, and life experience benefit the people of WB?
- What unique qualities do you bring to the table?
- Motivation? Why are you seeking this position?
- How have you demonstrated an interest and involvement in our community?
- Do you actively volunteer your time for Wells Branch? If so, how?
- Will you be present at our community functions?
- Will you listen when residents have questions or concerns?
- What do you see as the single most important issue facing Wells Branch?
- How will your election improve Wells Branch for all resdents?

These are all important questions; what have each of these candidates demonstrated in past positions and within our community? Ask.

Last, but certainly not least, I ask that the candidates and those supporting them choose their words both wisely and kindly. Emphasize your candidate's attributes, not your opponent's perceived shortcomings and PLEASE keep your campaigns positive. At the end of the day, we're ALL still going to be neighbors. We need to act like it and we need to be able to continue working together for OUR community come November 9th.

Make an Emergency Plan and Register for Central Texas Emergency Warnings

September is National Preparedness Month, and Travis County and the City of Austin are encouraging everyone to prepare for emergencies and register to receive emergency alerts. Central Texas is known as Flash Flood Alley, and in recent years, Travis County has faced deadly flash floods. Other emergencies, such as wildfires, tornadoes and severe weather, are not uncommon in our area, so planning and preparation are key to protecting life and property.

Don't wait. Communicate. Make your emergency plan today. Take practical steps now, so that you are informed and prepared to keep you and your family safe when emergencies occur:

- **1. Stay informed.** Monitor local news reports for emergency information. There may be no electricity during a disaster, so a handcrank radio is recommended. Travis County and Austin Twitter pages (@TravisCountyES, @austinHSEM and @austintexasgov) and Travis County Emergency Services and Austin HSEM Facebook pages (TravisCoEmergencyServices and DisasterReadyAustin) also provide updates during emergencies.
- 2. Register your cell phone, phone landline or email address to receive emergency alerts for your specific neighborhood at WarnCentralTexas.org. Contact information, including phone numbers and email addresses, is only used for emergency and major incident notification. WarnCentralTexas.org serves Bastrop, Blanco, Burnet, Caldwell, Fayette, Hays, Lee, Llano,

Travis and Williamson Counties. A nice feature of the emergency notification system, WarnCentralTexas.org, is that people can register several addresses for warnings, so if you have loved ones at a location separate from your home, you can also receive emergency notification for their location.

- **3. Stay weather aware.** Visit Weather.gov/safety to learn about weather emergencies. Follow ATXfloods.com during heavy rain and floods to monitor low-water crossing closures.
- **4. Build a disaster supply kit.** Your kit should include enough non-perishable food, one gallon of water per day per person, prescription medication and other supplies, such as flashlights, batteries and a first-aid kit. Learn more about disaster supply kits at Ready.gov/kit.
- **5. Make a plan** that extends from home to vehicle, workplace and other locations. Remember to have supplies at all locations, and keep vehicle fuel tanks at least half full.
- **6. Prepare your home** and decrease the threat of wildfires to you and your property by following the Ready, Set, Go! brochure at TravisCountytx.gov/wildfire.
- **7. Get involved**—Prepare your community for emergencies: For more information about National Preparedness Month and getting others involved, go to: Ready.gov/September or Ready.gov/es/Septiembre, and follow #NatlPrep.

Parking Safety Reminders for School Zones

- Do not park within 30 ft of a stop sign.
- Do not park within 20 ft of the designated crosswalks.
- Do not park right up to the edge of an intersection as this prevents emerging traffic from having clear vision and safe entry into the intersection.



- Do not block the driveways of residents even if only for a moment.
- Do not leave cars unattended. Park your car. Turn it off.
 Set the brake. Lock it and take the keys with you.

Please remember that everything we ask of you is for the safety of our children and their families.

***We've experienced issues with the areas surrounding Wells Branch Elementary (Town Hill/Merrilltown, Town Hill/Donald and Town Hill/Robert I. Walker), Joe Lee Johnson Elementary (Sauls/Crissom, Crissom/Kissman) and Athlos Academy (Shoreline/Cadoz) but please be respectful of all areas in or close to school zones. Even if there isn't a sign for it, please use common sense and courtesy when parking close to intersections or crosswalks. Thank you for helping keep our kids safe!

Parking Mobility Enforcement Class

Accessible Parking & Mobility Solutions will provide an initial training class at the WB Rec Center for parking mobility enforcement on October 23rd from 2-6pm.

Parking Mobility recruits, trains and manages citizen volunteers to help solve the universal problem of accessible parking abuse on the local level. Parking Mobility was developed and is operated by the disability community. The 501(c)(3) non-profit mission is to provide the solution to the #1 issue faced by the disability community every day. This is done through education and engaging community participation. Enforcement is essential, but education changes behavior.

A full four hour class is offered for those who have not been sworn in before. All current Parking Mobility Volunteers who complete retraining before November 1st can attend a two hour training instead of the usual 4 hour training. Contact Mack Marsh at mack@parkingmobility.com to register.

Raccoons & 'Possums & Rats, Oh My! Fall Clean-Up Time is Here

Chances are if you're reading this, you've had a problem with at least one of these critters in the last few months.

Rats contaminate food, damage and destroy property, and spread disease. Raccoons are destructive and possums can be a nuisance. All have been seen in Wells Branch recently.

The best form of control for any of these animals is an integrated plan that removes access to shelter, food and water. If you have a rat or mouse problem, then the use of rodenticides or traps *may* be necessary as well. *Every* resident in WB can take steps to minimize appeal to these animals.

- Do NOT leave food outside for your pets. If your animals eat outside, give them a chance to eat and then bring the food and water bowls inside.
- Secure all doggie-doors at night.
- If you have a bird or squirrel feeder, bring it in at night. Empty the birdbaths as well.
- Seal all openings into your home and any outdoor storage units using hardware cloth and steel wool. Mice can squeeze into a ¼" opening and it only takes ½" for a rat to gain access.
- Clean out any debris that might provide refuge for these animals.

Fall is the time when varmints start looking for a nice winter home. Old appliances, stacks of lumber, uncut brush and grass, old decking and hot tubs, etc. provide the perfect winter shelter. Now that the weather is starting to cool off, take a weekend to make sure your home and yard are protected.

If you have a neighbor who needs a little help getting his yard in shape, offer to lend a hand. Or better yet, organize a block clean-up party for one weekend. One of the neighborhood watch groups does this twice a year (spring and fall). All the neighbors gather early one morning, pool their tools and go house to house to help each other take care of large outdoor projects and get the yards ready for the next season. They finish the day with a cookout at a neighbor's house. It's an opportunity to bring everyone together and the whole neighborhood benefits from a pest-free environment.

Travis County discourages the trapping and relocation of healthy raccoons and possums. They recommend the aforementioned preventive measures instead. They will, however, come out if you have an animal "trapped" inside a living area. Should this happen, call 311 and ask for Travis County Animal Control.







RRISD MS Boundary Changes from roundrockisd.org

Round Rock ISD will continue its review for middle school attendance area changes considering updates to Cedar Valley, Chisholm Trail, Deerpark, and Walsh middle schools for the 2017-18 school year.

The District hosted its first two meetings September 15 and September 21, concerning the attendance area changes for middle school with the opening of Pearson Ranch Middle School in August 2017.

After evaluating its consultant's report that accounted for safety, growth, and demographics, the District determined it will focus on relieving overcrowding at Cedar Valley and Walsh, which could impact Chisholm Trail. It will continue to consider a change to Deerpark Middle School to align Joe Lee Johnson and Wells Branch Academies.

Our public hearings to discuss possible changes at Cedar Valley, Chisholm Trail, and Walsh are 7:30 pm in the following cafeterias:

September 28 at Chisholm Trail September 29 at Walsh

Changes to attendance areas will be limited to middle schools and will not include elementary or high schools. Students will continue to attend their assigned elementary and high schools as currently zoned.

After collecting public feedback on the demographer's proposal, the District will present its administrative recommendation at the October 20 regular meeting before the Board

votes on that recommendation at its November 17 regular meeting.

Round Rock ISD released its proposed middle school attendance area update for the 2017-18 school year with the opening of Pearson Ranch Middle School.


