This includes all MUD facilities, parks, trails, greenbelts, the Pond, drainage detention areas, the veloway, and the grassy area located at Robert I. Walker and Charla Circle. For any questions concerning firework use on district property, please contact the MUD office at 251-9814.

IN ADDITION, TEXAS LAW PROHIBITS THE DISCHARGE OF FIREWORKS ON SCHOOL DISTRICT PROPERTY. The Texas Occupations Code, Chapter 2154, Subchapter F, Section 2154.251 (a) (1), states that a person may not explode or ignite fireworks within 600 feet of any church, a hospital other than a veterinary hospital, an asylum, a licensed child care center, or a public or private primary or secondary school or institution of higher education unless the person receives authorization in writing from that organization.

#### **Leading by Example...Chuck Walters**

What you do, support, and how you volunteer your time matters. YOU make a difference. WBNA is starting a series on individuals who've helped shape our community as we've grown over the years. We'd like to begin by recognizing Chuck Walters as a champion of our community. Chuck celebrated his 20th year serving on the MUD Board this past May. An original resident of Wells Branch, Chuck first ran for the board because of his interest in the trail system and strengthening Wells Branch as a community. He worked with Texas Parks and Wildlife on three matching grants to improve our park system. The first was for the initial trail system, the second for Willow Bend Pool and the pond, and the third was for the construction of the Recreation Center on Shoreline.

Chuck is Chairperson of the Facilities and IT Committees and serves on the Recreation Committee as well. During his tenure, he spearheaded the Meditation Grove at the Pavilion, helped facilitate the Leslie Lane Meditation Garden and led the committee responsible for fence replacement along our major thoroughfares which not only changed the face of Wells Branch, but continues to help maintain property values for all Wells Branch residents. Above all else, Chuck brings two decades of cumulative knowledge to the table when dealing with issues affecting our community.

As our park system has aged, we've lost a number of old growth trees. Together, Chuck Walters and Bob Bauhs (Facilities) have worked with the Trees for Trails focus group over the last year to identify the areas most in need and prioritize plans for adding trees to the trail system. The efforts of this group as a whole have encouraged an interest in preserving natural areas, stream maintenance and an increased effort to maintain Wells Branch's natural amenities. Whether it's Keep Wells Branch Beautiful or neighbors gathering to clear out the invasive species in what will one day be our Natural Play Park, Chuck is there, working side by side with the rest of the community.

Chuck was instrumental in the creation of the Homestead Board to perpetuate the care and maintenance of the Gault



Homestead in the event of annexation. In addition, he has served on that board since its inception. The Homestead is the sponsor organization for both Cub Scout Pack 140 and Boy Scout Troop 1409. For the last twenty years, Chuck has volunteered as the Charter Organization Representative for both BSA Pack & Troop. He also served as Den Leader for his son, Dane and as a key volunteer for the Armada swim team for a number of years. When there was a shortage of crossing guards at WBE, Chuck stepped up and was out there every morning to help children get to school safely.

Chuck has contributed financially as well with donations to the library, BSA Pack 140 and most recently Wells Branch Elementary to help pay for shade trees by the Merrilltown playground.

Always a strong supporter of the WBNA and community involvement, Chuck volunteers each year at our Easter Egg Hunt and you can always find him at our National Night Out celebration, either at the grill or with a microphone in his hand. Chuck has always been ready to volunteer his time where needed, whenever asked and has had the honor of being Santa Claus at Luminary Fest more than anyone else in Wells Branch history.

Chuck has wholeheartedly given of himself and his time, and through his leadership has made this community even stronger. We thank you, Chuck for all that you've contributed to Wells Branch. You've made a difference in all our lives.

#### W2A Road Approval & Acceptance

Section W-2A, The Pond at Wells Branch, includes the following roads west of Wells Port: Rick Whinery, Quiet Pond, and Emmett Parkway. For background info, please see www. wbna.us=>community.

It appears the W2A journey will finally wind down this August and September. It's taken hard work and patience by many neighbors, board members and concerned citizens. Special thanks to the Citizen Committee comprised of Ed Peterson, Wendell Grimsley & Ravi Marawar.

If approved, each home in the W2A section of Wells Branch will be assessed a total of \$665.45, which spread over five years comes to \$133.09 per year with the option of paying a lump sum at once.

- · August 14 a public meeting will be held by Travis County Commissioners Court for affected residents
- · August 17 ballots will be sent out to homeowners
- · September 13 County Clerk will declare outcome of the election

Once the election is over and W2A residents have voted ""YES" the County will take responsibility for the necessary road and sidewalk repairs within W2A.

#### Graffiti around the Pond

The MUD has a 24 hour no tolerance policy which mandates that all graffiti be removed within 24 hours of being reported. If there is an overwhelming amount, it may take a little longer, but it will be handled as quickly as possible.



If you notice graffiti in Wells Branch *AND* it is not an act in progress, please photograph and send emails to pdean@ wellsbranchmud.com or text photos to 512-492-5707. The MUD Safety Committee reports all graffiti to the Travis County Sheriff's Office. Patricia will coordinate reporting and clean-up with the appropriate staff.

As always, If you see someone committing ANY crime, please call 9-1-1 IMMEDIATELY. When they answer, tell them you're in Travis County.

Call **911** to report "Suspicious Activity" as well. Some folks aren't comfortable calling 911 for any number of reasons, not the least of which is that they're embarrassed or afraid it may not be a "real" emergency. If in doubt about the safety of a situation *AT ALL*, **CALL 911**. The Sheriff's Office would much rather answer a false alarm than deal with a tragedy later.

For a crime that's already been committed (over, done with, criminal is already gone), or something you need the Sheriff's Office to check out, but feel you're not in danger, then 974-0845, press 3, is the non-emergency dispatch number for Travis County. Program it into your phone. A recording will answer. Press 3. This will take you to a live dispatcher. He/she will then determine the urgency of a call.



#### FREE VIN Etching

Thanks go out to the Goldfish Pond/Maple Hollow Neighborhood Watch Group who organized a FREE VIN Etching event on June 20 by The Sheriff's Combined Auto Theft Task Force for all of us here in Wells Branch. We had a



great turnout with 40 neighbors taking advantage of this opportunity to have their vehicles etched and save on insurance.

#### July is National Auto Theft Prevention Month

- Lock your doors.
- Remove your keys from the ignition and never leave your car with the engine running.
- Watch Your Car
- Close your windows completely.
- Never hide a second set of keys anywhere on your car.
- Never leave packages or personal items in plain view.
- Park with the wheels turned toward the curb, even in driveways or parking lots. This makes your car difficult to tow.
- Always use your emergency brake when parking.
- Park in well lighted areas or attended lots.
- Keep your registration card in your purse or wallet, not in your glove compartment.
- Activate any anti-theft device you have when you vacate your car.
- Have your vehicle identification number etched into your windshield.
- Hide or remove all valuables from vehicle.



#### Vacation "Close Patrol Requests"

If you're traveling this summer, take a few minutes to let the Sheriff's Office know you'll be gone. This is done by calling 854-9721 and telling them you'd like to file a "Close Patrol"

Request". If you have anyone house/pet sitting or picking up the mail, TCSO will want a description and vehicle information. Your address will be added to a list and when the deputies are in the area or have a free minute, they'll check on your home.

Make sure you park your vehicle on the right hand side of the street, no more than 18 inches from the curb. This includes stopping at mailboxes. A citation for this violation can cost up to \$150!

We've had yet another great season and WBSA was proud to be able to introduce a new activity - the Free Friday Skills Clinic, conducted by Coach Daniel Benito and his crew of coaches. We have had quite a few individual team successes to brag about, however, as a club, it is also important to highlight the path to success. As part of the WBSA efforts to improve the quality of the children's soccer experience and ongoing education for our volunteer coaches who may be new to the game, WBSA organized five free training sessions open to all WBSA players, each of the sessions were centered around the soccer "fundamentals" like dribbling, changes, passing, shooting and goalkeeping. Our coaches have been impressed with how these clinics have improved their kids' potential and their eagerness in showing their newly learned skills such as dribbling, changes, controlling the ball and short passes. I have been involved with youth soccer at WBSA as a coach, assistant coach, Registrar and now as President only for the past 3 or 4 years. It takes a lot to keep such an activity running for seasons and seasons (and WBSA has been in existence in one form or another for over 10 years). All this has only been possible with the wonderful support of the MUD Board, specially the Recreational Committee (Chuck Walters and Janet Maxey) and also the MUD management, including Jesse Kennis and Matt Fuller. At WBSA, we are extremely fortunate to have such support that helps to keep our costs low for our players!

Also, I just want to add a word of sincere appreciation to the WBSA Board Members, past and present. It is only with the foundation laid by all these folk that we're able to continue to provide the opportunities to the Wells Branch area kids as we have. I personally would like to thank Cash Miller, Raul Johnson, Matt Gavin, Cathy Ulcak, Cary Taylor, Jeff Navarro, Rudy Metayer and many others that I know have put in their efforts to keep this going.



## From Recent MUD Board Meetings by Debby Thompson New Efforts to Encourage Community Input & Involvement

At the June 4 MUD Board meeting, President Chuck Walters suggested that based on input from the recent Visions and Town Hall meetings, the Board should look at ways to encourage greater resident input and involvement.

- Director Walters proposed "Java Jolts" be held monthly or quarterly in which individual MUD Board Directors would host coffee house meetings with interested residents to discuss current issues and concerns. Residents could meet with one or all of the board members over a short period of time to voice their opinions and offer input on matters of interest in a much less formal situation than a MUD board meeting.
- Resident involvement at the committee level was also suggested by Director Walters. Many times residents aren't aware of
  issues being considered on a committee level until it comes up before the whole board. This would allow those with interests
  in certain areas i.e. finance or recreation, to attend the committee meetings and view backup documentation before
  recommendations are made to the board. Details regarding implementation and rules will be discussed at the July 2 board
  meeting.
- At the June 19 meeting Director Walters recommended the board return to "work sessions" at the first meeting of the month. In the past, the MUD board would focus on specific issues at these meetings, have their committee meetings in between and then have the individual committee reports along with consultant reports at the second meeting (third Tuesday of the month). Returning to this structure allows for more attention as a board working together on specific issues like disc golf or TCEQ mandates. Director Walters also mentioned inviting citizen communication not only at the beginning of the first meeting, but at points throughout.

Watch for announcements regarding these opportunities in the near future on both the MUD and WBNA websites. Like us (either one) on Facebook and receive updates as they become available.

#### **Crosswalks & Traffic Signs**

In response to concerns voiced at the last Visions meeting, Tom Cheshire & Janet Maxey (MUD Safety Committee) met with Travis County Commissioner Sarah Eckhardt and TNR representatives regarding signage and requests to install a 3-way STOP at the corner of Wells Port & Alpha Collier. Missing and damaged signs are being replaced throughout the district. Traffic flow on Alpha Collier doesn't justify a 3-way stop at this intersection. However, the County will be restriping all crosswalks in Wells Branch and is considering additional signage at this intersection. The potential of adding a flashing sign that would be activated when residents wish to use the crosswalk is a possibility but would cost the District \$30,000 if they choose to install one.

#### Wells Branch District Office Relocation & Renovation of Annex on Wells Port

WB MUD will be moving their District Office from its current location at 14205 Burnet Road to the Annex on Wells Port this September. Renovations to the Annex will begin soon so that it may accommodate District staff this Fall. Only a portion of the Annex will be used for District offices; both BSA & GS meeting rooms will remain intact.

#### Mills Pond Dam Compliance & Risk Assessment




