### Safety Tips to Teach Children

From the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children

Below we've listed some basic summer safety tips to go over with your children. There's also an emergency contact sheet you can download at www.wbna.us => Safety => Kids Summer Safety Tips, fill in and keep on the fridge just in case of an emergency. It may seem pretty basic, but in emergency situations, children can have difficulty remembering their names and addresses, much less how to contact Mom or Dad. We want everyone to have a safe, fun summer!

### For Parents:

Be sure your children know the rules about whose homes they may visit when you're not home and know their boundaries - where they may and may not go in the neighborhood.

Make sure children know their full names, address, and telephone numbers and how to use the phone. Be sure they know what to do in case of an emergency and how to reach you. (See info sheet) Children should have a neighbor or trusted adult they may call if they're scared or there's an emergency. Make sure they know who to contact and that it's okay to do so.

### **Rules for Kids:**

- Always CHECK FIRST with your parents, guardians, or the trusted adult in charge before you go anywhere or do anything. Be sure to CHECK IN regularly so that someone knows where you are at all times.
- Always TAKE A FRIEND with you when playing or going anywhere. It's safer and more fun.
- STAY AWARE OF YOUR SURROUNDINGS when outside. Don't crank up the music and focus on texting. Know where you are at all times and more importantly, what, or who, is around you.
- Stay **SAFER** when you're home alone by keeping the door locked; not opening the door for or talking to anyone who stops by unless the person is a trusted family friend or relative, you feel comfortable being alone with that person, and the visit has been pre-approved by your parents or guardians. Never tell anyone who calls that you're home by yourself. Say that your parents can't come to the phone right now and offer to take a message.
- Don't be tricked by people who offer you treats or gifts.
   Never accept anything from anyone without your parents' or guardians' permission.
- Never go into a public restroom by yourself.
- Never go alone to malls, movies, parks, or video arcades.

### Kid's Safety from page 1

Take a friend with you, and always CHECK FIRST with your parents or guardians to make sure it's okay and so that an adult knows where you are at all times.

- Be careful when you play. Don't play near busy streets or deserted areas and never take shortcuts unless you have your parents' or guardians' permission.
- Don't wear clothes or carry items with your name on the outside and don't be confused just because a person you don't know calls out your name.
- Don't get into or go near a vehicle with anyone in it unless you are with your parents, guardians, or a trusted adult.
   Never take a ride from ANYONE without CHECKING FIRST with your parents or guardians.
- Be careful playing or riding your bike as it gets dark. Wear reflectors and light colored clothing so that drivers are able to see you.

Don't be afraid to say **NO** and **GET AWAY** from any situation that makes you feel scared, uncomfortable or confused. **TRUST YOUR FEELINGS** and be sure to **TELL** a trusted adult if anything happens to make you feel this way.

# Get Ready for Severe Weather - Travis County ESD #2 Cares!

### Flooding: TURN AROUND, DON'T DROWN

Central Texas is known as a hotbed of flash floods, which are the #1 cause of weather-related deaths in the U.S. Most of these deaths occur when drivers try to drive through floodwaters, while others happen when pedestrians try to walk through or near flooded areas. Just six inches of rushing water can knock down an adult, and much less for a child.

It is NEVER safe to drive or walk into flood waters. Obey all barricades and warning signs. Many drivers overestimate the strength of their vehicles, and underestimate the water's strength and depth. Drivers often lose control of their vehicles – including SUVs and pick-up trucks – in just six inches of water, and it only takes 1 to 2 feet of moving water to force a vehicle off the road. Be especially careful when driving or walking at night when it's much harder to recognize flood dangers. If the forecast calls for heavy or steady rainfall, avoid parking, camping or hiking along creeks, streams, and rivers.

### Tornadoes: GET IN, GET DOWN, COVER UP

A tornado WATCH means tornadoes are possible. Remain alert and watch the sky. Get ready. Stay tuned to a weather radio or TV for updates. A tornado WARNING means a tornado has actually been spotted near you or indicated by weather radar. Take shelter now. If you're driving, never try to hide from a tornado under an overpass. You are safer in a low, flat location. Don't try to outrun a tornado while driving in a city setting or heavy traffic. Try to get into a safe building. Being inside is safer than being in a car, or near a car that can fly into you.

**GET IN!** If you are outside, get inside. If you're already inside, get as far into the middle of the building as possible. Enclose yourself in a closet or interior hallway.

**GET DOWN!** Try to go underground. If you can't, get down to the lowest floor/location possible.


**COVER UP!** Flying/falling debris is a tornado's #1 killer! Get under a sturdy table. Use bike helmets, coats, pillows, blankets, your arms, etc. to cover your head and body. Put on sturdy shoes.

### Lightning: WHEN THUNDER ROARS, GO INDOORS


If you can hear thunder, even a distant rumble, you are in danger and need to get to a safe place immediately. There is no safe place outside in a thunderstorm, fully enclosed buildings with wiring and plumbing provide the best protection. Sheds, picnic shelters, tents, dug-outs, and covered porches do not protect you from lightning. If a sturdy building is not available, get inside a hard-topped metal vehicle and close the windows. Avoid open areas, tall isolated objects, electrical equipment/wiring, baths and showers, and corded phones (except for emergencies).

Don't be fooled by blue skies! Lightning often strikes outside of heavy rain. The threat of lightning extends 6-10 miles outward from the base of a thunderstorm cloud. Many lightning deaths occur ahead of storms or after they seemed to pass.

### **RRISD Boundary Process Update**

from RRISD Board Briefs, May 9, 2016

At the May 3 Board Workshop, RRISD Trustees decided to continue with a tight discussion timeline, opting to not do surveys, forums, or focus groups, based on feedback from past attendance area changes. RRISD will begin the middle school boundary process with a single change recommendation in September 2016, followed by a minimum of two community hearings in October 2016, a review of the hearings and a final recommendation at the October 20, 2016 Regular Meeting, and an action item for the November 17, 2016 Regular Meeting. Middle School No. 11 will open in August 2017 on Pearson Ranch Road.



# **Celebrating 20 Years of Disc Golf in Wells Branch**

This year marks the 20th year of disc golf in Wells Branch. The original nine-hole course, installed in 1996 at the south end of Katherine Fleisher Park, placed seven fairways on the north side of WB Pkwy, with two fairways on the south side of the road. The original course was one of the earliest disc golf courses installed in the Austin area, arriving at a time when disc golf as a sport was experiencing a rise in popularity. A well-loved amenity even as a nine-hole course, residents frequently inquired at MUD meetings regarding the expansion of the course to 18 holes, and in 2012, the WB MUD approved a plan to expand the course to 18 fairways and move all the fairways south of WB Pkwy.

Several local disc golf enthusiasts collaborated with the MUD board and staff to implement a fun, community-oriented course, that is shorter than many of the other courses in the area, but enjoyable for players of all ages and skill levels. The grand opening of the new design was held in March 2013 and marked by the first annual Wells Branch Disc Golf Tournament. In addition to this annual tournament which attracts around 70 players each year, the WB course has played host to fundraising events for the Austin Food Bank, St. Andrews Food Pantry, Ronald McDonald House, medical fundraisers for community members needing assistance, as well as an annual tournament focusing on military veterans, which will take place again at the WB course this September.

The greenbelt where the course is placed has changed a lot over the past 20 years. Recent years of drought, especially 2011, stressed many trees to the point of death. To support the continued health of the area, the WB MUD started a Trees for Trails campaign that replanted the area along the trail at the north end of the original course. Although these plantings didn't extend south of WB Pkwy to the 18 fairways of the new disc golf course design, local disc golfers organized to establish the Wells Branch Disc Golf Club, and 60% of each club member's \$10 annual dues are allocated towards purchasing trees to revitalize the greenbelt where the course is situated. To date, the WB disc golf club has sponsored the purchase of 44 trees and bushes, providing a visible sign of regrowth in the area and generating a pride and enthusiasm for care of the course by players and the neighborhood. I work with the MUD and Austin Parks Foundation each March and September to organize volunteer park work days to keep our park looking it's best, and this March we had our biggest participation ever, with over 90 volunteers helping out to clean the area and plant trees.

As a WB resident, I have met a lot of new friends at the WB Disc Golf Course, and each time I play, I see couples, families with children, and players of all ages enjoying the sport. I hope you and your family take the opportunity to visit the Wells Branch course soon. It's a beautiful area of our park system, and it is full of friendly people who would love to play a round of golf with you!

### **Solar Energy in Wells Branch**

In October of 2014 a group of Wells Branch solar advocates held a Solar Energy Fair (http://wbna.us/community/solar-energy-fair/) and followed that up with a Solarize project in January of 2015 (http://wellsbranchsolar.blogspot.com/). Solarize projects are where a group of people get solar education en-masse in exchange for state of the art solar installation at a lower price. At least 40 WB homes have "gone solar" since the solar fair.

Stephen Hochstetler, one of the WB Solarize team has documented the process. The Hochstetlers are Oncor customers with GreenMountain as the billing company. They had already



made their home energy efficient before the solar install.

"After installing a 22 panel 5.6kW system we have had a bill reduction of \$85 in both Aug and Sept and have now gone 6 months with no electric bill. We currently have a credit of \$60. We are happy to save money and live greener at the same time! We are on track for our solar system investment to 'break-even' in 7 years or less."

Here are some of the factors that gave the Hochstetler's a successful solar plan and installation:

- (1) Proper goal sizing We looked at a year's worth of usage (https://www.smartmetertexas.com/CAP/public/) and determined the annual electrical usage was 9100 kWh. Our goal was to generate 90% of that with solar (8190 kWh).
- (2) We needed to know the pitch of the roof (steepness) and the azimuth (angle) as these affect the efficiency of the panels. Our roof has a pitch of 30 degrees, which is perfect because the Latitude of the Austin area is 30.2 degrees. Our roof azimuth is 209 degrees (this is 29 degrees west of due south)
- (3) Finding the right system size with http://pvwatts.nrel. gov. After putting in our roof numbers (from step 2) we decided on a 5.6 kW system with an estimated annual output of 8363 kWh per year. I am happy to help my neighbors with this website interface.
- (4) Choosing the efficiency of solar panel to be installed. The lower the wattage per panel, the less expensive it will be. We were fortunate to have adequate space to choose the lowest wattage panel (lowest cost).
- (5) It is helpful if the quotes they give you include a 'monitoring' system where you can look at your solar output from a web browser. Otherwise, how will you know if you've blown a fuse?
- (6) Make sure you understand the warranties and the cost of an extended warranty so you can compare those across the 3 vendors.

A solar installation company will help with the above steps. If you are ready to find out the details of a solar pv install on

### **Vacation Safety Tips**

### If you plan to be away:

- Let a neighbor and/or block captain know you'll be out of town and when you'll return. They should have the following: your emergency contact information; contact information for anyone with access to your house (pet sitter, etc.); when they should be expected; what they look like and a description of their vehicle(s).
- Let only those who NEED to know, know when you are going out of town.
- Don't share vacation plans OR photos on social media.
- Arrange to have your lawn cared for if you are going to be away.
- Don't hide keys under doormats, flowerpots or in similar places.
- Put your lights, stereo and/or TV on timers.
- Leave a car in the driveway or ask a neighbor to park in it.
- Don't cancel your paper or mail deliveries; ask that your neighbor pick them up every day.
- Leave a key with a friend or neighbor; ask that the house be checked at regular intervals.
- Keep your house well lit at night (backyard included). A motion sensor or photocell activated light is an inexpensive deterrent.
- Store all your valuables.
- Consider asking friends or relatives to live in your home while you are away.
- Ask your neighbor to put trash in your trashcan and to put it out for collection and away when they put theirs

File a Close Patrol Request. The filing of this form alerts patrolling officers so that they may pay close attention to one's residence. To do so: Contact the Travis County Sheriff's Office at 512-854-9721. Ask to make a Close Patrol Request. You will be asked for information on those caring for your home while you're away: make and model of their vehicles, name, description and times they should be at your home.

"For anyone getting quotes who wants to sit around a table to have them 'peer' reviewed by a neighbor who has solar, I am willing to help you look at them. There are many factors in each house that can affect quotes such as installing on a 2nd story roof can be more expensive than installing on a 1 story roof. Another common issue is the need to replace/upgrade the breaker box on an older home. All of that should be written in the quote. - Steve"





### Summer Birding in WB by Wanda Holcombe

### **Hummingbirds are back!**

Follow these tips to help care for and attract them:

(Summary from http://www.birdwatchersdigest.com/bwdsite/learn/hummingbirds/attract.php)

- Tie an orange ribbon round the old oak tree. Use footlong pieces of surveyor's tape (bright red or orange plastic ribbon sold in hardware stores) to catch the eyes of passing hummingbirds. Tie these pieces to bushes, trees, deck railings—anyplace near flowers or feeders. Or, tie a red bandana nearby your feeder.
- **Don't remove those spider webs.** Hummingbirds use spider web as a main ingredient in their nests.
- Deadhead your flowers to enhance blooming all summer.
- Rehabilitate your old feeders. If the red parts on your hummingbird feeders are getting a bit dull, repaint using bright magenta nail polish. Or, replace old feeders.
- Add more feeders; two or three feeders in the vicinity of the first feeder will attract multiple hummingbirds.
- Add a more native plant species to your garden.
- Plan a continuous blooming schedule for the summer.
- Make your own sugar liquid: 1 part sugar to 4 parts water. Remember to change weekly!
- Add a mister to your yard....all the birds will love this too! Monthly Bird Walks


