#### WB Voter Turnout 2014 by Michele Samuelson

It is the duty of every citizen to exercise the privilege of voting, and it is never more important than it is in local elections. With another election season in the books, we're able now to go back and determine just how our community did in terms of turning out to choose the leaders in our most immediate governing board, the Wells Branch MUD board of directors.

Our total number of registered voters in Wells Branch is down to 9414 (it was 10,572 in 2012). The percentage of those voters participating in the election is likewise down to 37% from 57%. This is about what we'd expect in a non-presidential election year. There are a certain number of individuals who only vote every four years, regardless of what is on the local ballot. But with the high profile nature of this year's MUD director elections, we do find it somewhat disheartening.

The highest number of ballots cast in each of the four Travis County precincts occurred in the race for governor. In hard numbers, Precinct 225 took the lead with 1183 votes cast in that race, and percentage-wise, Precinct 216 took the crown with nearly 50% of registered voters participating. Precincts 215 and 229 came in at 820 and 890, respectively, or 37% and 44%. The gubernatorial race drew a total of 3485 ballots cast in Wells Branch's four precincts, and the Place 5 race for MUD director drew a total of 2047 ballots cast. To put this in perspective for the MUD races: in 2012, in the Place 4 election, one precinct saw 1008 ballots cast. This year, in that same precinct, 732 ballots were cast in the race for Place 5, which saw the highest amount of interest this year from Wells Branch voters.

Overall, Wells Branch is on par with the county and the state in voter turnout, but we believe we can do better. The WBNA provides voter registration and candidate forums to help educate voters in our community. As we look to 2016, and we seek to match or exceed the turnout from 2012, we hope to see all of you participate in various ways, including helping getting our neighbors to the polls.

#### Branch BBQ & Catering Celebrates 20 Years in WB! by Gus Kohn

After managing a Texas Tumbleweed Steak House and later working as a salesman for Sysco Foods, Chris Carby wanted to be his own boss. On December 1, 1994, Chris and Catherine bought and began running Branch BBQ which for two years had been operating in Wells Branch but not having great success. With hard work and persistent dedication, they resurrected the business. Offering good food at reasonable prices, the Carbys began what has become a successful restaurant and catering business. With 12 employees now and 20 years behind them, I asked Chris what made Branch BBQ such a sensation.

They got their first catering job in their first week of business; cooking for 700 people each day for two days for the Grand Opening of Ropers nightclub. Imagine, catering 1,400 meals the first week in the restaurant business! Chris says the kitchen was inadequately equipped to store the prepared food for the big event and he called everyone he knew with refrigerator space to handle it, but handle it he did and thus began the catering champion that Branch BBQ & Catering is today.

As tribute to Dot of Dot's Place ("his other

mother"), Chris offers his Friday specials;

Chicken & Dumplings, Turnip Greens and

Candied Yams with rolls. Chris' many specialty



recipes have evolved over time to become what they are today. Recipes like Collard Greens, Green Bean Casserole, Smoked Catfish

& Peach Cobbler have become local favorites. Get there by 1pm on Fridays or don't expect there to be any Green Bean Casserole left; he makes a limited amount.

The secret to Branch BBQ & Catering's success is hard work, quality offerings, doing the right thing by people and very importantly, being a member of the community. They are present at every FourthFest, they cook the turkey, ham, potatoes and stuffing we all enjoy at the Thanksgiving Pot Luck dinner hosted by the WB MUD, they support a number of

community service groups like
Northwest Elementary, WB Disc
Golf Club, Friends of the Library
and WBNA among others. Chris is
the voice of Connally Cougar
Football, and you will see him
behind an apron doing what he
loves best at National Night Out.

## **Carbon Monoxide Poisoning Prevention Tips**

Carbon monoxide (CO) is a gas that you cannot see, taste or smell. Each year, 184 children in the United States die due to carbon monoxide poisoning and more than 20,000 children visit the emergency room.

Young children are especially vulnerable to the effects of carbon monoxide because of their smaller bodies. Children process carbon monoxide differently than adults, may be more severely affected by it, and may show signs of poisoning sooner. Symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning include headache, nausea and drowsiness.

Fuel-powered devices can provide wonderful benefits to families when used properly. But they also underscore an important necessity in the home: the need for a carbon monoxide alarm. Carbon monoxide poisoning can result from faulty furnaces or other heating appliances, portable generators, water heaters, clothes dryers, or cars left running in garages. At its worst, carbon monoxide can cause severe side effects or even death.

#### **Top Tips**

- Make sure your home has a carbon monoxide alarm. As with smoke alarms, install a carbon monoxide alarm on every level of your home, especially near sleeping areas, and keep them at least 15 feet away from fuel-burning appliances.
- Carbon monoxide alarms are not substitutes for smoke alarms, and vice versa. Combination smoke and carbon monoxide alarms are available.
- Don't use a grill, generator or camping stove inside your home, garage or near a window.
- If you need to warm a vehicle, remove it from the garage immediately after starting it. Don't leave a car, SUV or motorcycle engine running inside a garage.
- If using gasoline-powered devices, store gasoline in a locked location where children cannot access it. Keep only small quantities in an approved container that has child safety features.
- Keep gasoline away from any source of heat, spark or flame. Even common household appliances such as water heaters and clothes dryers can start a gasoline fire. Be sure to store your gasoline away from anything that could ignite it.

#### What YOU should KNOW about YOUR

Water Bill by Margret Wingrove, Crossroads Utility Services Utility Manager, Wells Branch MUD

Billing: Our meter reading team reads every meter in the District every month. Each month your water bill shows a billing period from the 21st to the 20th with the meters being read between the 11th and the 15th, depending on the calendar for that month. The water usage is billed in 1,000 gallons and is calculated by subtracting the previous meter read from the current meter read. The monthly bill details the read dates, the previous meter read, the current read, and the usage as well as the current charges. Also shown is a 12 month history of water usage making it easy to compare the current usage to the usage for the same month the previous year. This is the first thing you should check when you receive your bill. If your usage is much higher with no change in your watering habits, it may indicate a leak.

Water bills are mailed around the 1st of each month. The past due date is always the 20th of the month. If the 20th is a weekend or holiday, the due date is the next business day. A 10% late fee is added if the payment is not received by 5:00pm on the past due date.

All payments are posted to customer's account the date the payment is received. This applies to all payment options.

Winter Wastewater Averaging - The monthly sewer charge is based on the winter average or the actual amount of water used, whichever is less. The winter averaging period this year began November 11th and ends February 11th. The average water usage of these three months will determine the maximum amount of sewer usage that will be charged for the next 12 months. This is the time to conserve water!! The irrigation system should be turned off and used only when necessary. Toilets need to be checked to make sure they are not leaking. An easy check is to take the lid off of the water tank and add food coloring to the water. Don't flush and check after 20 minutes. If the water in the bowl has the colored water in it, the toilet is leaking and the flap valve needs to be replaced. A leaky toilet can greatly affect the water usage.

#### Northwest Elementary News By Betsey Harper



As the fall colors around our neighborhood start to disappear and the winter holiday decorations start to appear, school children lose their education focus and start to daydream. How can we blame them? I know I have a hard time too. Here are

some ways to help your child stay focused until winter break:

- **Get the wiggles out first.** Moving the body motivates the brain. Make sure your child has had a chance to run, walk, or jump around *before* sitting down to homework.
- Turn off screens and electronics. Before your kid tackles homework or does anything that takes concentration, turn off the television, and remove the cell phones and electronics.
- Make a to-do list. Having a lot of chores and homework assignments can be overwhelming for kids. Help your child focus on getting things done by making a list together of everything she/he needs to do for the day or week. Then let her/him cross off each task as they finishes it for small successes.
- Use signals. Try to avoid conversations when your child is working. To cut out distracting talk altogether, you and your child can even come up with a few basic signals. For example, when you point to his work, which means she/he needs to go back to what he was doing.
- Take breathers. During homework time, make sure your child takes a few breaks. After working for 10 or 20 minutes (depending on their age), have them get up and move around, get a drink, and then go back to work. But don't let them get involved in something else during the break. Just make that time a relaxing few minutes.

#### Results from the 37th Waterloo Disc Golf Classic

#### Holiday Safety Tips by Debby Thompson, WBNA President and Wells Branch Neighborhood Watch Coordinator

With the bustle of the holidays just around the corner, now is the time to make sure we're taking every precaution to keep our homes and ourselves as safe as possible. We usually see an

increase in opportunistic crime this time of year; we need to be especially vigilant.

- Keep your blinds and drapes closed when away, even if only for a short period of time.
- Keep your house well lit at night (backyard included). A motion sensor activated light is an inexpensive deterrent.
- If your Christmas tree is displayed in front of a window, don't pile the presents around it. Store the gifts in another area away from view when the blinds or drapes are open.
- Do NOT put the empty boxes for the new computer, TV, stereo system, etc. on the curb for the trash. Take the time to break down every box and put it inside your trashcan/ recycling bin so that it is concealed, even if you have to hold it over to the next week. People start cruising our neighborhood on Sunday afternoons to see what has been put out. The less they know, the better.

Door-to-door solicitations increase tremendously this time of year:

- Always look out the window or peephole before opening the door or answering a knock.
- Never open the door all the way, especially if you have a Christmas tree and/or presents in plain view.

While shopping this holiday season, remain aware of your surroundings at all times. If unsure of your safety, ask a store attendant to have security walk you to your car. You can't be too safe. This goes for trips to the grocery store as well.

- When unloading your car at home after a day of shopping, lock it between trips to and from the car.
- Always lock your car.
- Never leave your car running unattended or leave your keys in the car or ignition.
- Never leave the garage door remote control in your car (when your car is not parked in the closed garage). Thieves check car visors and this gives them instant protected access to your home.
- Don't leave valuables in plain view, even if your car is locked. Take them in the house or put them in the trunk out of sight BEFORE arriving at your destination.

If you plan to be away:

- Let a neighbor and/or block captain know you'll be out of town and when you'll return.
- Leave the following info: your emergency contact information; contact information for anyone with access to your house (pet sitter, etc.); when they should be expected; what they look like and a description of their vehicle(s).

- Let only those who NEED to know, know when you are going out of town.
- Don't share vacation plans on social media
- Do NOT post vacation pictures while you're still on vacation-the posting can wait until you're back home!
- Arrange to have your lawn cared for if you are going to be away.
- Don't hide keys under doormats or flowerpots or in similar places.
- Put your lights, stereo or TV on timers.
- Leave a car in the driveway or ask a neighbor to park in it.
- Don't cancel your paper or mail deliveries; ask that your neighbor pick them up every day.
- Leave a key with a friend or neighbor; ask that the house be checked at regular intervals.
- Keep your house well lit at night (backyard included). A motion sensor or photocell activated light is an inexpensive deterrent.
- Store all your valuables.
- Consider asking friends or relatives to live in your home while you are away.
- Ask your neighbor to put trash in your trashcan and to put it out for collection and away when they put theirs away.
- File a Close Patrol Request. The filing of this form alerts patrolling officers so that they may pay close attention to one's residence. To do so: Contact the Travis County Sheriff's Office at 854-9721. Ask to make a Close Patrol Request. You will be asked for information on those caring for your home while you're away i.e. make and model of their vehicles, name, description and times they should be at your home.

If you are not already, become a Wells Branch Neighborhood Association member. "Like" us on Facebook for community updates. The more community involvement and connectedness there is, the safer we all will be.

Most of all, be aware of your surroundings and look out for your neighbors. If you see or hear something suspicious, call 911. The Sheriff's Department would much rather answer a false alarm than deal with a tragedy later.

We live in a GREAT community AND a SECURE neighborhood. Let's all do our part to keep it that way. Here's to a safe and happy holiday season!


