USE OF FIREWORKS ON MUD PROPERTY IS PROHIBITED AT ALL TIMES. This includes all MUD facilities, parks, trails, greenbelts, Mills Pond, drainage detention areas, the veloway, and the grassy area located at Robert I. Walker and Charla Circle. For any questions concerning firework use on district property, please contact the MUD office at 512-251-9814.

IN ADDITION, TEXAS LAW PROHIBITS THE DISCHARGE OF FIREWORKS ON SCHOOL DISTRICT PROPERTY. The

Texas Occupations Code, Chapter 2154, Subchapter F, Section 2154.251 (a) (1), states that a person may not explode or ignite fireworks within 600 feet of any church, a hospital other than a veterinary hospital, an asylum, a licensed child care center, or a public or private primary or secondary school or institution of higher education

unless the person receives authorization in



Fireworks Safety Tips

Annually just under 10,000 Americans are injured by fireworks. If you choose to celebrate with fireworks this 4th of July, follow these safety tips from the Travis County Fire Marshal:

Before you shoot:

- DO NOT LET YOUR CHILDREN BUY FIREWORKS WITHOUT ADULT SUPERVISION
- Only buy from reliable fireworks vendors
- Never experiment or attempt to make your own fireworks
- Store fireworks in a cool, dry place
- Find a smooth, flat surface away from the house and other buildings, or dry leaves and grass
- Be sure to have water handy in case of a malfunction or
- ALWAYS HAVE ADULT SUPERVISION!



When you're ready to shoot:

- NEVER ALLOW CHILDREN TO PLAY WITH OR IGNITE **FIREWORKS**
- Always read and follow label directions, warnings, and instructions
- Be considerate of your neighbors
- Only ignite fireworks outdoors, and away from houses and other buildings
- Be sure other people are out of range before lighting fireworks
- Light only one firework at a time
- Never try to re-light fireworks that have not fully func-
- Never give fireworks to small children, even sparklers can cause serious burns
- Never throw fireworks at another person, vehicle, or animal
- Never carry fireworks in your pocket
- Never shoot fireworks in metal or glass containers
- Dispose of spent fireworks properly CLEAN UP the STREET

Yes, Keep Conserving Water— The Drought Is Not Over!

Nearly a month ago we saw the devastating Memorial Day floods rip through Central Texas bringing Mills pond to the highest level I have ever seen, only to be followed by more flash floods tied to Tropical Storm Bill. May was the wettest month on record.


As expected after all of this rain, I have seen many comments suggesting it is time to end watering restrictions because the 'drought is over.'

But, weather and water experts disagree. Instead, the word coming from everyone from the state meteorologist, the Texas Water Development Board and conservation specialists is this. The past five years have shown us what can happen when we come close to running out of water. The implications are huge for people, industry and our economy. We have learned that without a reliable water supply, our lives can be forever different.

Wells Branch buys our water from the City of Austin, so we are dependent on the water in Lakes Travis and Buchanan for our drinking water. As a matter of practicality, we are to follow the restrictions put forth by the LCRA and the City of Austin. But, we have also been able to easily keep our lawns growing with watering once a week, and even Saint Augustine grass will survive in the August heat with once a week watering. This has been proven in many tests. It may not be lush green you see today, but don't forget that if not for some simple geology and geography, we wouldn't be able to have even small green plots of grass. We do live on the edge of a desert. To their credit, many residents understand this reality and have added xeriscape lawns and gardens and adopted rain barrels and drip irrigation as the smarter way to maintain excellent looking yards even in the worst of droughts. Plus, the MUD is doing their part by using their new highly productive well for park irrigation. Keep in mind that throwing expensive drinking water on the ground is not the smartest use of our limited life sustaining resource.

We don't want to fall into what is a known 'affliction' that tends to follow after drought. Many of us are aware of the hydrological cycle, which describes the natural movement of water through oceans, clouds and rain. But, after drought, many of us fall into "the hydro-illogical cycle." This known effect occurs when we go through periods of wet weather and we forget that drought can happen. Eventually things dry out and suddenly we notice there's a problem and panic sets in, and before we can really do anything permanent to solve the problem, it rains again and we forget that there's going to be another drought coming. This is the fear of water professionals all over the State.

The solution is simple. Today could be the beginning of the next drought. The conservation practices learned during the drought's peak should be continued, despite the recent soaking. All of us in Wells Branch should keep following the best practices of adding and maintaining low water landscaping and gardening techniques and watering yards once a week. It's good for all of us, saves water and money. It just makes good sense.

We LOVE our Rat Snakes! by Brad Dushkin



It's been a warm, wet spring and the snakes abound. A rat snake looks intimi dating but is actually beneficial to our area. It is non-venomous and usually eats

rats, mice, and sometimes birds and lizards, killing by constriction. It is not a threat to you, your kids or pets.

It can look like a rattlesnake and might even shake or vibrate its tail as a defense mechanism to try to resemble a rattle-snake, which unnerves those who encounter it. However, it is reluctant to bite unless you try to capture it. Rat snakes are the most common large snake in central Texas (up to 6 ft!) and help keep rodent populations in check. If you come across one, just let it be; it'll slither back into the sewer or ditch on its own.

Tip of the Month from Your Emergency Services District: Cooking Fires

Let us identify some behaviors that reduce the number of cooking fires in our community.

- Most cooking fires involve the stovetop.
- The most common type of cooking fire is cooking left unattended. Stay with the item cooking.
- Curtains, towels, paper towels and paper plates should be well away from the burners.
- Wearing tight fitting sleeves or short sleeves are recommended. Baggy sleeves can be ignited by the burners.
- If a pan does catch fire, turn off the burner and carefully slide a lid or cookie sheet over the top of the pan, smothering the fire. Do not move the pan on fire. Wait until it is cool before re-opening.
- Stop, drop, and roll will smother the fire if clothing is ignited.
- If you are burned, run cool water for 3-5 minutes over the burn to cool it off.

Summer Sun Safety – Essential in Central Texas

It's that time again, the kids want to be outside every daylight moment; the lawn begs for regular attention; and WB's great pools and playgrounds are beckoning to be used. BUT, enjoying the summer outside leaves our skin vulnerable to one of the deadliest forms of cancer—malignant melanoma.

Did you know that every blistering sunburn received before the age of 18 GREATLY INCREASES the chance of developing skin cancer as an adult? Here are some tips to help prevent damaging sun exposure in both adults and children.

- Stay out of the sun during peak hours (10am-4 pm)
- Wear a wide brimmed floppy hat, the wider the better
- Use a high SPF of sunblock (the higher the SPF the longer you have protection) with both UVA and UVB protection
- Put your sunblock on indoors, 30 minutes before sun exposure
- When swimming or sweating a lot, pat yourself dry (rubbing will remove your sunblock) and reapply according to the manufacturer's instructions
- When possible, wear light colored long sleeves & pants to protect skin
- Wear UV-protective sunglasses to shield your skin and eyes from the sun
- Avoid Indoor Tanning

Minimizing your children's exposure to sunlight between 10am and 4pm and keeping them covered up when they are in the sun will help protect them from future problems. Again, scientists have found a link between childhood sunburn and skin cancer later in life. As teens and adults, we should all avoid exposure to radiation from sunlamps, tanning parlors, or other artificial tanning devices. Exposure to UV rays from any source can lead to skin damage.

Let's all be smart and safer in the sun this summer as we enjoy all that WB and Central Texas has to offer!



Notice of Change to WBNA Bylaws

The Bylaws of the WBNA were last revised in 1999 and have needed to be updated for some time. Below is a brief list of proposed revisions for member consideration. The original Bylaws as well as the proposed Bylaws are online at WBNA.us under the "About Us" tab. Please review and post any comments you may have to the website or email info@wbna.us. A general meeting of the Wells Branch Neighborhood Association will be held at the end of July to consider the recommended amendments. Date and time TBA via the website, Facebook and the Wells Branch Google Group.

Current boundaries are listed by plat and do not include any of the homes built after 1985. Proposed boundaries will be expanded to include all of Wells Branch.

An increase in number of Directors from six to seven is also requested as an additional board member will allow us to better serve the community.

Officers are currently elected by position with one year terms. We propose replacing this system in the following manner:

- Place Numbers 1 through 7
- Two year staggered terms beginning in 2016
 - -Each Director shall draw for a place number upon ratification of this document
 - -Even places shall be elected in even years; odd places in odd years beginning in January 2016/2017
 - -Self Alignment with division of duties for the following positions following each election:
 President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary,
 Director (x3). The Board may realign at any time and the title of Director may be replaced with appropriate positions as needed (e.g., Events Coordinator, Communications, Community Liaison).

Currently, a vacancy remains unfilled until the next general meeting of the members. Due to the infrequency of "general meetings" as opposed to "events", it is proposed that the board appoint a successor to serve until the next general meeting where they may be ratified or replaced by the members.



Located at 1500 Royston Lane, just north of Grand Ave. Pkwy, Concordia High School is the closest Christian High School to the Wells Branch population. This year was a special

year for the school and for the recent 2015 graduating class. The 22 senior graduates will be attending such Colleges and Universities as Auburn, Southwestern, TX A&M, Texas Tech., Baylor, The University of Texas and others all over the country. It is noteworthy that the available scholarships offered to all the students totaled over \$3.1M as a group or about \$141,000. per student. New "No Parking" Signs on Shoreline

If you frequent the Rec. Center, you may have noticed the new "No Parking" signs on Shoreline near the entrance/exits. In the past, residents have parked right up to the driveways along Shoreline during events; this made it difficult for those exiting to see oncoming traffic without pulling out into the intersection and putting themselves in harm's way. The WBNA would like to thank Deputy Robert Phillips with TCSO for looking out for the safety of our neighbors by having these signs installed.

As a reminder, please do not park within 50ft. of entrances/ exits to the Rec. Center parking lot, within 20ft of the driveway to the fire station at Shoreline/Bratton, 20ft of a crosswalk at an intersection, 30ft from stop signs or 15ft from fire hydrants. Parking next to a crosswalk reduces visibility for both the pedestrian and driver. Let's keep Wells Branch safe!
