Travis County Community Development Block Grant Program Meeting hosted by the WBNA

As a neighborhood association, we're interested in how we can better serve our residents and increase community involvement from those living in our apartment communities as well as our single family homes. Wells Branch has several new apartment complexes that have opened recently or plan to open in the near future. As a group, we've been concerned about a lack of infrastructure and amenities where some of these apartments are located. We will be reaching out to the management teams for the 20+ complexes we have in our area and encouraging attendance at the upcoming CDBG meeting. We'd like for you to join us as well.

Every year, Travis County receives approximately \$997,649 in federal funds from a program called the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG). CDBG program funds housing, infrastructure and social services projects for residents with low and moderate income that live in the unincorporated areas of Travis County. Residents and non-profit agencies can help determine projects by providing project ideas and proposals. Travis County Health and Human Services will explain the CDBG program and provide our community paper copies of the Participation Form so that we may provide our comments and ideas to the Commissioners Court by March 31st.

Residents will have the opportunity to learn more about the program, present community needs and recommend projects for CDBG funds at the meeting. Please make time to attend.





Fire Station Set for Remodel to Enhance Services

Remodeling the fire station at 15300 Bratton Lane is one of the initiatives outlined in Travis County ESD. No 2/Pflugerville Fire Department's strategic plan. Construction is slated to begin in the Spring of 2015 and it is anticipated to take 4 months to complete. The station will remain completely operational without any disruption in ability to respond to emergency calls.

The station, built in 1999, was designed to house one company responsible for responding to emergency calls within the district west of Interstate 35. According to the census bureau



the population in the Wells Branch area has nearly doubled in the last 15 years and continues to grow. The Department's call volume out of this station has increased by 107% since 2006. This station represents about 30% of the current District's call volume. The District responded to almost 8,000 calls in calendar 2014, which represents an overall increase in call volume of 60% District wide since 2006. "When we evaluated the needs to support the increased calls out of this station, it was more cost effective to expand the current station at this time than to build another station." said Assistant Chief Kevin Croegaert.

The remodel of the station is part of the Department's commitment to expanding services. In 2014, nine first responders trained and prepared for paramedic level certification. The remodel will allow for additional response capabilities housing an aerial, an additional engine, or an additional squad comprised of an EMT-Basic and a Paramedic at the station and to emergency medical calls.

Equipment and Safety Improvements

Included in the remodel plan is upgrading to 24-hour power generation. In the event the main power source is disrupted, the generator will prevent a power outage at the station; thereby, enabling personnel to continue their ability to respond to emergency calls.

The safety of the community as well as the safety of firefighters remains a priority for the Department. The station improvements will include space for a Health and Fire Safety Officer position. Among other duties, the Safety Officer monitors conditions and hazards associated with the emergency



call such as the weather, building, vehicle and patient. On a different side of safety, clothing worn by first responders must be properly cleaned to ensure that contaminates do not remain on the clothing potentially

Monarchs, Milkweed, & Wells Branch The plight of the Monarchs, milkweed, and

how we all can help: by Betsey Harper and Shelley Palmer

Various environmental and scientific groups have requested that the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service protect the Monarch butterfly and list it as a threatened species, pointing to a dramatic population decline over the last 20 years. These groups list milkweed habitat loss as a major reason for the decline in Monarch populations. Monarchs rely heavily on the milkweed as a host plant. Females lay eggs on the leaves of the plant, and the young caterpillars feed on it. The diet makes the caterpillars and the adults toxic and bitter tasting to predators such as birds.

How YOU can help - Milkweed is incredibly hard to grow from seed. We've had much better results with native milkweed "plugs" available through Monarch Watch http://www.monarchwatch.org/. Order now so they arrive as early in spring as possible. Texas orders ship in late April or early May. Order Green Milkweed (*Asclepias viridis*), the most common milkweed in Texas or Antelope Horns (*Asclepias asperula*) which gets its name from the seed pods that look similar to the horns of an antelope.

If EACH of US plant some native milkweed in our gardens, we can help to ensure that the beautiful Monarchs continue their long trip through Texas every year.

Yard Waste Reminders

To participate in the curbside yard waste recycling, please place clippings in open containers (round black tubs) or the recyclable brown paper bags available for purchase at home stores. TexaScapes will not pick up grass cuttings or leaves in plastic bags. Branches should be cut in 6ft lengths and bundled together.

As the weather gets warmer, this type of recycling increases dramatically. Clippings should be placed curbside by 7am Monday morning. Some weeks, it may take TexaScapes two or three days to collect all the clippings throughout the neighborhood so please be patient.

Free Mulch

As a courtesy to residents, the WB MUD provides free mulch for pick-up at the Rec. Center on Shoreline. Please check in at the desk before loading your vehicle and limit yourself to four of the "Green Gold" containers (black tubs) so that all residents may have the opportunity to utilize this service.

close. It was a beautiful afternoon for planting over 40 native plants, and the use of one yard of compost & three yards of mulch. All focused on what is bird, animal and insect friendly and supportive.

Thanks to Austin Native Plant Society of Texas who donated \$100, TexaScapes, WB MUD Board & Office/Maintenance Staff and all the Wells Branch individuals who donated plants, funds, and energy towards the development of the Nature Viewing Station as a place for all who visit the Mills Pond Park area of Wells Branch to enjoy. The Nature Viewing Station serves as a model of what can be planted in home yards to be "nature friendly" and support the care of the environment by planting native plants and using organic planting materials.

Solarize Wells Branch! by Stephen Hochstetler



Would you like to live greener by having your house to be more energy self-sufficient? Would you like to reduce your energy bill? You can do both at the same time! Both of these will be the result for anyone who participates in the "solar-

ize" group purchase of a rooftop solar photovoltaic (PV) system. In January a panel of homeowners selected Lighthouse Solar as the winning vendor from the 7 companies that responded to our request-for-proposal.

What is the financial benefit? The panels have a performance warranty for 25 years and you can expect a financial breakeven in approximately 7 years. This gives you 18 years of electricity after the system has paid for itself.

The 2014/2015 Solarize WB Project enrollment is **OPEN** for Wells Branch residents and neighboring communities.

There are several reasons that NOW is a great time to explore to see if your roof has the space and sunlight for solar panels.

- 1 TAX BREAK The 30% Federal tax credit exists in 2015 and 2016. In 2017 the tax credit is reduced to 10%.

The solarize vendor has run three group design sessions where each homeowner walks away with a proposal and an appointment for a roof measurement/assessment.

1-Enrollment and education. NO COMMITMENT REQUIRED. Go to http://wellsbranchsolar.blogspot.com/p/timeline. html and sign up. You will get invited to the next group design workshop by expressing interest in a solar PV system.

2-Design Workshop. STILL NO FINANCIAL COMMITMENT.Bring an electric bill to the design workshop to determine your annual usage. Your roof will be virtually assessed and your goals listened to. You can choose what size solar PV system you want to install and the vendor will look to see if you have roof space with sunshine. You will get a proposal from vendor and also an appointment to do an onsite evaluation to validate the proposal. Roof measurement, pitch, alignment, condition and electrical boxes are items reviewed onsite.

3-Installation. After evaluation a contract is sent to the homeowner for signature and financial commitment begins.


