

These restrictions remain in effect at ALL times even if the County is not enforcing a fireworks or burn ban.

USE OF FIREWORKS ON MUD PROPERTY is prohibited at all times. This includes all

MUD facilities, parks, trails, greenbelts, the Pond, drainage detention areas, the veloway, and the grassy area located at Robert I. Walker and Charla Circle. For any questions concerning firework use on district property, please contact the MUD office at 251-9814.

In addition, Texas law prohibits the discharge of fireworks on school district property. The Texas Occupations Code, Chapter 2154, Subchapter F, Section 2154.251 (a) (1), states

that a person may not explode or ignite fireworks within 600 feet of any church, a hospital other than a veterinary hospital, an asylum, a licensed child care center, or a public or private primary or secondary school or insitution of higher education unless the person receives authorization in writing from that organization.

Fireworks Safety Tips

 DO NOT LET YOUR CHILDREN BUY FIREWORKS WITHOUT ADULT SUPERVISION



- Only buy from reliable fireworks sellers
- Never experiment or attempt to make your own fireworks
- Store fireworks in a cool, dry place
- Find a smooth, flat surface --away from the house and other buildings, or dry leaves and grass
- Be sure to have water handy in case of a malfunction or fire
- ALWAYS HAVE ADULT SUPERVISION!
- NEVER ALLOW CHILDREN TO PLAY WITH OR IGNITE FIREWORKS
- Always read and follow label directions, warnings, and instructions
- Be considerate of your neighbors
- Only ignite fireworks outdoors, and away from houses and other buildings
- Be sure other people are out of range before lighting fireworks
- · Light only one firework at a time
- Never try to re-light fireworks that have not fully functioned
- Never give fireworks to small children, even sparklers can cause serious burns
- Never throw fireworks at another person, vehicle, or animal
- Never carry fireworks in your pocket
- Never shoot fireworks in metal or glass containers
- Dispose of spent fireworks properly CLEAN UP the STREET

Disc Golf by Brian Litke

Disc Golf is a growing sport, and in May, Wells Branch hosted the 2nd annual Wells Branch Disc Golf Tournament, celebrating the one-year anniversary of expanding the course to 18 holes. The day was blessed by

plentiful sun and wind, keeping the temperature low and the scores high. We had 29 players register in 5 divisions. Door prizes included an iPod Touch, Branch BBQ Family Pack, ThunderCloud Subs gift certificates, and a Stan's A/C cleaning. Participants received a WB custom stamped disc, and winners of each division received a WB mini marker disc. The top four scores were all posted by Wells Branch residents: Mike Shay (46), Jerry Perez (48), T.J. Elders (50), Kyle Goens (50). Our youngest player was an 11-year old (who scored a 58) and the oldest was a 65-year old (who scored a 57).

Thank you to the WB MUD for supporting disc golf at Wells Branch. I see an increasing mix of young and old, male and female playing the course, and I think short courses like WB are a very positive amenity for any community. Just last weekend, I met a foursome of players in their 50s, and one of the female players told me they were playing here for the first time and she expressed how much they enjoyed the course design, because it was approachable by a variety of skill levels. Wells Branch really is a course for everyone.

I welcome you to visit the WB disc golf course to give it a try. Park along Owen Tech Blvd. across from the Whataburger.

If you take up the sport of disc golf, you may want to explore a few other courses in the area.

- North Town Disc Golf Course is in Pflugerville off Harris Ridge Blvd. between Wells Branch Pkwy and Howard Lane. This course recently installed concrete tee boxes, and it is a slightly longer course when compared to Wells Branch.
- Cactus Patch is a 9-hole course across from McNeil High School. The course starts behind Crosspoint Church, near the YMCA entrance.
- Brushy Creek MUD Disc Golf Course is north of Wells Branch off 620. It is a nice 18-hole course.



This complex replaces the former pool that closed

You can enjoy outdoor vending or bring a cooler. Bartholomew pool is about 15-minutes from Wells Branch. Admission to the pool is \$2 for kids 1-11, \$3 for kids 12-17, and \$4 for adults. than others and social groups vary from dorm to dorm.

- •Traditional Style means you have community bathrooms. No, it is not as scary or gross as it sounds, but you are going to want flip flops.
- RA's are amazing people, and they will come to your aid when you need it most.
- Keep a small medical kit with: Band-Aids, burn cream, Neosporin, sanitary wipes, gauze, and medical tape. You never know with all those stairs, man.

Vacation Safety Tips

If you plan to be away:

- Let a neighbor and/or block captain know you'll be out of town and when you'll return.

 They should have the following: your emergency contact information; contact information for anyone with access to your house (pet sitter, etc.); when they should be expected; what they look like and a description of their vehicle(s).
- Let only those who NEED to know, know when you are going out of town.
- Don't share vacation plans on social media.
- Arrange to have your lawn cared for if you are going to be away.
- Don't hide keys under doormats or flowerpots or in similar places.
- · Put your lights, stereo or TV on timers.
- · Leave a car in the driveway or ask a neighbor to park in it.
- Don't cancel your paper or mail deliveries; ask that your neighbor pick them up every day.
- Leave a key with a friend or neighbor; ask that the house be checked at regular intervals.
- Keep your house well lit at night (backyard included). A motion sensor or photocell activated light is an inexpensive deterrent.
- · Store all your valuables.
- Consider asking friends or relatives to live in your home while you are away.
- Ask your neighbor to put trash in your trash can & to put it out for collection and away when they put theirs away.
- File a Close Patrol Request. The filing of this form alerts patrolling officers so that they may pay close attention to one's residence. To do so: Contact the Travis County Sheriff's Office at 512-854-9721. Ask to make a Close Patrol Request. You will be asked for information on those caring for your home while you're away: make and model of their vehicles, name, description and times they should be at your home.

Northwest Elementary News By Betsey Harper



The school year is over and your kids haven't done anything besides relax, play, eat, and sleep? I know we all need a break from the craziness the end of the school year brings as we transition into summer. But, as a parent,

you've put in hard work to get your students on a path to reading and learning success during the school year. Research shows children can lose up to three months of reading progress over the summer months, and that loss has a cumulative, long-term effect? For example, by the end of 6th grade, children who consistently lose reading skills over the summer will be two years behind their classmates.

Many schools in our area have returned to the required summer reading list to encourage students to read, but that can often make reading seem more of a chore than a pleasure, for both kids and parents. Fortunately, our community library offers a summer reading incentive program that can help. Rather than a list of required reading or suggested reading that 'meets academic needs,' we should offer our kids a list of 'books you won't be able to put down' to keep them engaged in summer reading.

Did you know that research from the University of Tennessee found that allowing children to pick out their own books or reading materials not only helped close the summer reading gap, it worked just as effectively as summer school. The results show children will read more and ultimately learn more with this freedom of reading choice.

Here are some other ways and suggestions for keeping your students reading over summer break.

- Follow your kid's teacher classroom reading. Most classroom teachers read a book or two throughout the school year. Find out if it was part of a series or if the author has other books.
- Become your child's partner in reading. Build on what they like - dinosaurs, animals, sports, superheroes, music and more—so that you can have fun and interact meaningfully with your children while helping to strengthen their reading skills.
- Make it fun. Going to the new waterpark in Pflugerville?
 Pull up the website and let them read all about it and the other great waterparks in our area.
- Reading for pleasure is one of the building blocks needed for young people to grow into healthy, productive adults. Have a safe and engaging summer!

Birding in WB-The Usual Suspects

We had a brief but delightful "wave" of migrating birds in Wells Branch this spring. May was particularly productive with several warblers, vireos and a Mississippi Kite seen around the pond and in the surrounding trails. It was all about being at the right place and at the right time, and craning your neck up to the tops of the trees. Check out some of the gorgeous photos taken by Rob White on the WBNA Facebook page under the album titled "2014 Spring Summer Rob White Photos". A heavy rain during the bird's migration season with a strong north front had the effect of causing a "fall-out" where, for a short time, Yellow, Wilson's, Black-throated Green, American Redstarts, and Blackburnian Warblers as well as Red-eyed and Warbling Vireo's were spotted feasting on little insects and caterpillars in the tree canopy before more conducive southerly winds encouraged them further northward towards their summer breeding grounds.

The Wells Branch guided bird walks are taking a pause for the summer as the days are hot and the bird activity slows down. This is a good time to get to know the "usual suspects". The Green Herons have been especially active and even set up a nest in a WB neighbors' backyard tree. Hatchlings are vulnerable and have a better chance immediately after they fledge from the nest if pet cats are kept indoors.
