Bike & Trail Connectivity Meeting

April 20 • 7pm

WB Community Center • 2106 Klattenhoff

The WBNA will be hosting a meeting coordinated by the Public Works division of the City of Austin to include the planners for COA urban trails, bike lanes, and sidewalks, as well as the corresponding Travis County departments as WB is in the COA ETJ. There'll be a presentation followed by a Q & A session with a basic overview of the current systems in place and what is planned (Urban Trails, Tier I & Tier II and forecast timeline for safe overall connectivity for Wells Branch and far North Austin, off road where possible).

Our neighborhood has invested heavily in our trail system, but the MUD can only affect trails within its boundaries; we're isolated here and cannot easily and safely connect to any other trail system. Coordination of central authorities (Travis County, COA, MUD) to develop plans to connect our neighborhood with other communities would be ideal. As one resident put it, "I can ride my bike pretty much anywhere but the level of safety that I feel varies greatly depending on the infrastructure. If I could ride with my boys up to the train station, SAFELY, we could get downtown and tool around the lake. Same goes for getting to Walnut Creek."

Our goal for this meeting is to find out, as residents in the ETJ, how we can impact the plan and where to start. We look forward to learning more and hope you'll join us!

The City of Austin is hosting **Walk & Bike Talks** to discuss a **Pedestrian Safety Action Plan** and implementing the **Bicycle Master Plan**. See wbna.us for details and meeting dates.

Mr. PC's Computer Corner by Dave DeVore

Not a day goes by that I don't see the aftermath of various computer viruses, malware, phishing scams, fake telephone or Internet "tech support" hoaxes, etc. To help keep my WB neighbors safer from these threats, and to save myself the aggravation of fixing these avoidable problems, I will concentrate in the next several months in this space on several simple ways that we can protect ourselves. Please share this information with your friends and families.

The threat that we'll look at this month concerns pop-ups or web pages that won't let you leave them without clicking on something. When you get to a web page and a suspicious pop-up window appears, the web site you've gone to is more than likely infected, or not the actual web site you thought you were navigating to. How can this happen? You can demonstrate it easily for yourself. Google "HP Tech Support" and the first 4 or 5 results are ads for fake web sites, complete with BBB, Microsoft and HP logos, an 800 number and usually a chat window to get live "help." The real HP web site is further down the search results page. Never click on a popup you are unsure of because it means, "Please infect my computer."

What should you do if you find yourself stuck on a sketchy web page or get a questionable popup? Here comes that old standby, CTRL+ALT+DEL, to the rescue. You old-timers will remember this keystroke combination we used to restart the old DOS computers. You tap all three keys at once. Windows computers use this to bring up a screen with several useful options. One of them is Task Manager. You click on it and a program appears which allows you to highlight the offending browser or program. Left click on its name, for example, Google Chrome, then go to the bottom right of the window and click End Task. The program is ended without clicking on any of the bait the bad guys have set out for you. The next time you use the program or browser you just canceled, it will probably ask if you want to Restore pages. Say NO or click X, otherwise, you will be right back at the web site you were trying to escape from. Problem solved!

Severe Weather & Deutschen Pfest

May is Severe Weather Preparedness Month for the Wells Branch and Pflugerville communities. While flooding, tornados, lightning, and heat waves are facts of life in this region, they don't



have to be deadly! By taking a common sense approach and discussing your plan as a family, you can keep yourself and your loved ones safer from these natural threats this Spring and Summer.

Flooding: TURN AROUND, DON'T DROWN

Flash floods are very common in Central Texas. Most people who lose their lives in floods were in cars with drivers who tried to drive through floodwaters. It only takes 1 to 2 feet of moving water to force a vehicle off the road —



even an SUV or a pick-up truck! It is **NEVER** safe to drive or walk into flood waters. For pedestrians, just six inches of rushing water can knock down an adult.

Always obey all flood barricades and warning signs. Be especially careful when driving or walking at night when it's much harder to recognize flood dangers. If the forecast calls for heavy or steady rainfall, avoid parking, camping or hiking along creeks, streams, and rivers. Remind your children to never play near bodies of water during or after heavy rain.

Tornadoes: GET IN, GET DOWN, COVER UP

A tornado **WATCH** means tornadoes are possible. Remain alert and watch the sky. Get ready. Stay tuned to a weather radio or TV for updates. A tornado **WARNING** means a tornado has actually been spotted near you or indicated by weather radar. **Take shelter NOW!**

Get In! If you are outside, get inside. If you're already inside, get as far into the middle of the building as possible. Enclose yourself in a closet or interior hallway without windows. (If you're driving, never try to hide from a tornado under an overpass; you are safer in a low, flat location. Don't try to outrun a tornado while driving in a city or traffic. Just try to get into a safe building; being inside is safer than being in or near a car.)

Get Down! Try to go underground. If you can't, get down to the lowest floor/location possible.

Cover Up! Flying/falling debris is a tornado's #1 killer! Get under a sturdy table. Use bike helmets, coats, pillows, blankets, your arms, etc. to cover your head and body. Put on sturdy shoes.

Lightning: WHEN THUNDER ROARS, GO INDOORS


If you can hear thunder, even a distant rumble, you are in danger and need to immediately get to a safe place. Fully enclosed buildings with wiring and plumbing provide the best protection. There is no safe place outside in a thunderstorm. Sheds, picnic shelters, tents, dug-outs, and covered porches ESD News continued on page 5



Butterfly Bulletin by Shelley Palmer, Texas Master Naturalist

To create your own butterfly habitat, you'll need:

- A couple of nice flat rocks in a sunny spot. Since insects are cold blooded, they depend on the sunshine to get their juices going in the morning.
- Also needed is a shady place where they can hide from the intense heat of midday.
- Shelter from strong winds so they can keep their fragile wings from being torn.
- Host plants for their caterpillars to munch on.
- Plants that are nectar sources for the adults.
- Mass plantings of host and nectar plants (not just one or two plants), because the butterflies are often competing with each other and with other species for the same food.
- Having a variety of plants with bright flowers planted, so that as one kind of flower finishes its bloom, another flowering plant comes into bloom, providing a constant food source.
- No pesticides! Not too crazy about herbicides either.
- Keep some leaf litter in an area in the yard to aid the butterflies in winter survival.
- Have mud puddles for them to drink the water and absorb minerals. (They also like rotted fruit.)
- Keep bird feeders in a separate part of the yard, so your butterfly garden doesn't become a bird buffet.

Be sure and visit our own WB Eastside Butterfly Garden. Park just north of the WB MUD Annex at 14611 Wells Port and follow the trail east southeast.

Planting for the Monarchs:

Monarchs can use many nectar plants but they will be looking for milkweed to lay their eggs. Our natives are the best to plant: Antelope Horn - *Asclepias asperul,* Green Milkweed - *Asclepias viridis,* Swamp Milkweed - *Asclepias incarnate*

Problems with planting Tropical Milkweed (Asclepias curassavica) in Central Texas

Possible problems are:

- Ophryocystis elektroscirrha (OE) disease spores build up on overused Tropical Milkweed plants.
- The Monarchs aren't finishing their fall migration because viable milkweed is available year-round in the US. Tropical milkweed doesn't die back on its own in some of our warmer winters.

It is hard to know how big a problem these issues are. The fix is to cut the plant back in late fall when you see a drop in Monarch activity. Tropical Milkweed should be planted along with our native milkweed.

do NOT protect you from lightning! If a sturdy building is not available, get inside a hard-topped metal vehicle and close the windows. Avoid open areas, tall isolated objects, electrical equipment/wiring, and baths/showers. Also avoid using a corded phone, except for emergencies.

Don't be fooled by blue skies! Lightning often strikes outside of heavy rain. The threat of lightning extends 6-10 miles outward from the base of a thunderstorm cloud. Many lightning deaths occur ahead of storms or after they seemed to pass.

Coyote Sightings in WB

With the increase in construction just north and west of Wells Branch, we've seen a rise in coyote sightings inside the neighborhood, hearing packs at night, and reports of several missing cats. Typically coyotes like to keep a low profile, BUT January to March is their mating season and they

can become more aggressive. Then, when they have/raise pups in April & May, the Moms need a lot of calories to keep the pups fed.

As they go through this annual cycle, be sure to keep cats indoors and dogs on a leash, especially around dawn & dusk.

Contact information, including phone numbers and email addresses, is only used for emergency and major incident notification. WarnCentralTexas.org serves Travis, Williamson and surrounding Counties. A nice feature of this emergency notification system is that people can register several addresses for warnings, so if you have loved ones at a location separate from your home, you can also receive emergency notification for their location.



More than 30 volunteers helped out at *It's My Park Day* in Wells Branch this year, staffing projects in KF Park and at the WB Disc Golf course. Although rain threatened, it was clear during the project, and we finished our plantings just in time for the rain to come and keep the new grasses and trees well-watered. Thank you to the families, members of Cub Scout Pack 728, board members Janet Maxey and Shelley Palmer, members of the WB Disc Golf Club, and thank you to the WB MUD for purchasing the inland seat oat grasses and the WB Disc Golf Club for purchasing the trees planted during the workday.

Volunteers planted 46 inland sea oats along the steep creekbed rear the low-water crossing at the WB maintenance area to prevent soil loss. We have seen that similar plantings that were added to the butterfly garden over the past few years have given that creek bank new life, and the seeds from the mature plants are seeding themselves down the sides of the bank. We hope the added plantings will also spread themselves along this steep area of the creek. It's a positive impact for the creek and it makes the area look great.

We also planted three desert willow trees (popular with buterflies), a Mexican plum tree, and two Monterrey oak trees. These drought-tolerant trees will provide new life to the greenbelt and help maintain the tree population as we lose trees each year to drought or old age.

Thanks again to everyone involved, the Austin Parks Foundation and sponsors Wheatsville COOP and KIND bars. The next volunteer day for It's My Park Day will be this fall, but I hope you'll also come out to the monthly Keep Wells Branch Beautiful events. They're a great way to spend some time outdoors and show your community spirit.
