All Wells Branch residents (both in-district and out-of-district) are invited and encouraged to attend this meeting. Your WBNA membership must be current in order to vote in the election or run for office. The WBNA Board has seven members, each serving a two year term with assigned place numbers. Odd numbered places are elected during odd years; even numbered places in even years. This February, we'll be selecting board members for places 2, 4 and 6.

During 2021, the WBNA team rallied with tremendous effort to return to our normal schedule of events as much as possible. We made an extra effort to offer socially distanced options whenever feasible. The recent return to "stage 5" pandemic alert may limit upcoming events. In late 2021, both Lara Bennett (1) and Jon Klekman (5) announced that they would be stepping down from their current roles. Jon had additional family and work commitments arise that will limit his volunteer time, thanks to Jon for his contribution. The board would like recognize Lara's 23 years of service. Educational Meeting on Coyotes Thursday, March 3, 2022 | 7:00pm WB Community Center | 2106 Klattenhoff Drive

This meeting will immediately follow the WBNA Annual Meeting. We're excited to have Sarah Hollers, a former Wildlife Protection Officer for Travis County here to speak on coyote behavior. Sarah is no longer living in the Austin area, however, she's still active in wildlife education. She'll be discussing coyote history (why they are here), hunting (why killing doesn't work), peak seasons, breeding seasons, hazing, attractants, and pet safety.

Travis County contracts with the City of Austin for ETJ Wildlife Management. We found out recently that both Wildlife Officer positions are currently vacant. Given the increase in sightings, we felt it necessary to have a speaker out to answer questions. Sarah CANNOT take complaints. She is only here to educate. 311 continues to track movements, data, and populations (good and bad behavior). Always report concerning activity—like when coyotes are not responding to hazing efforts during the day. BUT, it is natural to see them in the daytime, especially due to the proximity of greenbelts and current breeding seasons.

Biometric authentication. What a mouthful! Simply put, biometrics are measurements and calculations based on individual human characteristics. Authentication, when used in the context of access to computer systems and much more, can include anything from passwords, to figuring out a "I am not a robot" CAPTCHA puzzle to using your iris ala Jack Bauer to open a door at a secure location. Put these two ideas together and you have your unique characteristics, pieces of who you are, being used to do everything from screening the crowds at the Superbowl for terrorists through facial recognition to making a purchase at Whole Foods via the use of your palm print. If this sounds farfetched, look around you, these things and more are already happening.

In 1985, I went to DePaul University to study computer science at the ripe old age of 33 and mainframe computers were beginning to be used to develop neural networks, software that could learn and hopefully mimic human intelligence eventually. At that time, computers could identify a coffee cup if it were sitting on a perfectly level surface. Tilt it only a little and artificial intelligence had no clue what it was. How far we have come, with smart phones being unlocked with a glance at our faces, our laptops being opened with a fingerprint and Alexa, Siri and Google knowing us and all of our daily routines by matching our unique voiceprints.

The advantages? Our logins can be more secure, faster and convenient. You may forget a password, but you always have your fingers, eyes and voice with you. This biometric data is hard to spoof or fake. Checkouts at stores with a scan of your hand are safer than credit cards which can be lost or stolen.

Disadvantages? It is quite costly to add it into existing systems. A password can be reset if you are hacked. If your biometric data is hacked, what do you do? Our ever-diminishing privacy will be decreased even more as additional ways are developed for us to be tracked. And there is always the chance we will be confused with someone else since no system is perfect.

Technology is neither good nor evil intrinsically. Time will tell whether these advances in security will enrich our lives or become a nightmare beyond anything Orwell could have conjured up.

Going Trashless by Monica Koenig

Have you ever had this experience? One harmless little trip to the grocery store or one stop for take-out practically fills my entire trashcan with waste to toss or recycle. All this waste contributes to climate change, but, as I tell myself guiltily, it can be hard to feed a family from the grocery store without leaving an impressive pile of stuff to throw out. Many times I've thought, "I'd like to do something about all this trash, but it's just the way it is. What can one little person do?" I'm delighted to say I've found a different way. A local company named Trashless calls itself the "milkman for everything." The milk I order every week comes in glass jars that I set out again empty next week for return... like it's 1950 and I'm Mrs. Cleaver. But with Trashless it doesn't stop with milk... pantry items, produce, even meal kits and take-out are delivered in containers that get picked the up the next week and reused.


I'm particularly bothered by plastic waste, so I kept track of my trash and recycling for a few weeks and made notes about the products I buy that come packed in plastic. Now my family regularly buys tortillas from Trashless and there's no plastic bag to put in the recycling. I buy a pound of spinach every week that comes in a box I return for reuse. Apples and potatoes come in cloth bags that get returned and reused. My Wells Branch neighbor, Natalie, also a Trashless customer, says, "I love reducing my waste and carbon footprint, the care Trashless takes in picking out high quality and ethically sourced foods, and how easy they make things by delivering right here in the neighborhood."

I know Natalie because she comes by my house on Surrender Avenue to pick up her Trashless orders. My house is a Pick-Up Point...all the deliveries for our neighborhood arrive at my house and neighbors stop by to pick up their orders, no delivery fee required! Not only does it save money, one neighborhood Pick-Up Point allows deliveries to be made in fewer stops, using less fuel and lowering the carbon footprint of delivery.

Other zero-waste initiatives are always in the works at Trashless. The Trashless Reuse Army is a network of volunteers – including my neighbor Natalie – who collect ice packs, lightbulbs and dead batteries that will be picked up by Trashless and recycled or reused. From a program promoting reusable coffee cups to a new system to make takeout zero waste, Trashless really stands behind their mission.





The Wells Branch ECO Fair, an Earth Day Celebration, will be a little early this year - April 3, 2022, 1:00-4:00pm in the gym at the Wells Branch Recreation Center. Come celebrate our wondrous planet and discover ways we can better use our precious resources for the benefit of all.

Energy — **Solar Vendors** will be on hand to share information on rooftop solar and battery solutions, costs and rebates. Oncor and Austin Energy will be onsite to speak to residential rebates and Energy Saving programs.

The 4 Rs — Reduce, Reuse, Recycle and Repurpose

The WBNA will showcase the 4Rs — There will be a display on how to greatly reduce the use of plastics, including ways to create your own household products plus examples of recycled art and on-site art projects to make from repurposed materials. Local scouting groups will be on hand with bulk trash hauling service information and younger scouts will help the kids with the popular "cardboard construction" activity. There will be science-based presentations and educational demonstrations that will help you understand how the water utility hardware works in your home. We'll have examples of low maintenance projects you can do in small spaces to benefit our pollinators, the kids can make seed balls, there will be a great tree give away and we will even send you home with pet lady bugs! We will explore Wells Branch's Urban Forest efforts and where we go next. Great Texas groups like the A&M Urban Foresters, Master Gardeners, Master Naturalists, Audubon and our own local Ask an Arborist will be there. 
