

#### Janet Maxey

#### May 2, 1952 - December 29, 2022

I once asked my mom what her dream job was. If she could do anything, and money or time wasn't a factor, what would she want to be? What would she want to do? I'll never forget her answer.

"I've always wanted to be a mom. That was my dream job."

She continued working when I was a young child, foregoing staying at home when I was a baby. Instead, she traded the first five years of my life and all the milestones I couldn't remember so that she could retire when I was school-aged and be a dedicated "room mom" for the years I would remember.

And her plan paid off.

We moved to Wells Branch not long after I started school, and there isn't a time in my memory where my mom wasn't involved in the sincerest way, be that at school or in the neighborhood she wanted to raise her children in. It started with field trips and class-room parties, and then quickly turned into WB Armada, 4th Fest, Luminaries, and countless other moments I cannot remember because they became so intrinsic in her identity.

My mom worked tirelessly behind the scenes of many iconic WB events, well before she ever became a MUD board director. I like to say she wore a lot of different hats in her long career of service. It brings a smile to my face and a little laugh because she also wore a lot of literal hats! I honestly believe her signature style served as a uniform that cemented her into people's memories. "Just look for the lady wearing a ball cap" was something I heard many, many times over the years.



I count myself blessed to have grown up with a strong woman who embodied the idea of leading by example. In my youth, she counseled patience and compassion. As a teen and young adult, she helped me unfold the complexities of doing the right thing in a world that isn't black and white. Kindness and service were the common threads that ran through everything I consider my mom to be made of. While she was far from perfect, she was as good a human being as I could ever hope to know and learn from.

For those of you who did not know my mother, if you take anything away from reading this, I'd like to let you know that she was incredibly stubborn. It was the core of her being!! I would consider her stubbornly fair. That trait alone enabled her to work alongside neighbors, other MUD directors, district employees, and contractors, constantly striving toward a shared goal of bettering Wells Branch.

To all of you in WB that did know my mother, whether you counted her as a friend or not, I want to let you know she considered it a great honor to serve all of you in the ways that she could. She spent countless hours helping to make this neighborhood a place where people could thrive and foster a sense of community. It was not something she just talked about. It was something that she truly believed and was at the core of her being.

She enjoyed every MUD meeting, potluck, 4th Fest, casino night, concert in the park, disc golf tournament, committee meeting, swim meet, and WB event she attended.

From my family to all our WB neighbors: thank you for the love that was poured out onto my mom the last weeks of her life. She was immensely touched, and it brought her comfort during a difficult time. Reading your messages and well-wishes kept her spirits up until the very end.

It is my hope that she's remembered fondly for her dedication, her kindness, her sense of humor.... and all those baseball hats!



### **Kevin Reese July 1, 1964 - January 6, 2023**

Kevin Bjorn Garst Reese, 58, passed away peacefully at his beloved home surrounded by his family, his books and his cats on January 6, 2023, after a fiercely fought battle with liver cancer. His name, Kevin Bjorn - means "friendly bear". The people who met Kevin, knew him to be that indeed.

His family was a most important part of him. With Rosaura working next to him, they renovated several homes, including their own. He would be found playing video games with his children, encouraging his 3 sons to all become Eagle Scouts, and working with them on the job. His sons are all succeeding because he taught them to work hard, figure out the problem, and be confident in what they want to do. Being around Kevin was never boring. He had the Reese Family trait of stirring up trouble, annoying the hell out of everyone, then making them laugh.

Whether you knew Kevin as a friend, neighbor, through Reese Renovation, Boy Scouts, or the many events he volunteered for via Scouting, he always had a smile on his face, was happy to see you, and ready to help. He will be missed.

From Kevin's last story he wrote, as the heroine finished her work and was leaving: "Hey" he called to her, "Who are you?" and she replied "It's not Who I AM that's important, It's What I AM." And then she was gone, lost in sight to the rising sun.

Be on the lookout for door hangers or flyers with ordering information that a nearby Girl Scout might leave at your door. Many girls have signs in their yards with a link and/or QR code to their online cookie store. This contactless delivery method works much like if you were to buy cookies from her at your door, the sale goes to the girl, and she'll be responsible for the delivery if you have selected Girl Delivered. There are no extra fees to order girl delivered cookies. After you enter your contact information and place an order, the girl's parents will receive an email and can confirm if they have the required cookies and can deliver.

This year's cookie line up has the classics; Thin Mints, Caramel Delites aka Samoas, Peanut Butter Patties aka Tagalongs, Lemonades, Peanut Butter Sandwiches & Trefoils aka Shortbreads, along with the newer flavors Toast Yay & Adventurefuls Cookie! Come February 10, a brand new flavor, Raspberry Rally, will only be available through the online Direct Ship option. It is a crispy, berry flavored cookie dipped in chocolate. As a bonus, if you buy 9 to 12 boxes through Direct Ship, your shipping is half price. Be sure to ask your neighborhood Girl Scout for more details.

If you want to buy in person, check out Girl Scouts of Central Texas website for a cookie booth near you. The Girl Scout cookie program will continue through February 26, 2023 unless extended due to weather. 



#### Join the Wells Branch Google Group!

Welcome to 2023! The Wells Branch Google Group has 1100+ members and serves as a valuable communication resource for our neighborhood. Thank you to all our members for reaching out to your neighbors and sharing information. If you haven't joined yet, please consider doing so.

The group is maintained by volunteers and has no official affiliation with the WB MUD or with Wells Branch Neighborhood Association (Both being excellent organizations!) This is a routine reminder of how the Group works, highlighting a few areas:

**REMEMBER THE FOOTER** - every message includes automated text added at the bottom. If you need the link to the Guidelines or the moderator address or the email address to participate - look there.

**GUIDELINES** - it's a good idea to review these now and then. Here are a few points that sometimes get overlooked:

**Respect privacy** - A good example is if you are reposting info from elsewhere, remove previous TO/FROM email addresses before sharing. Only share the **content** (and possibly relevant contact information).

Refrain from political commentary and debate. General information like notices of candidate debates or reminders to vote are fine

#### Avoid Excessive Postings - Key examples:

If you are selling <u>many</u> items, please consolidate into a minimal number of messages. Do not send a separate message for each item.

We aren't saying you are limited to one email; but please - not 5, 6, 8...and then that many again as you post updates to what has sold. If you have a local or home-based business, restrict promotional emails to a reasonable number such as once or twice per month.

#### POSTING MESSAGES

To share a new message, simply send an email to: wellsbranch-neighbors@googlegroups.com.

Remember, this information is in the footer of every message you receive if you forget.

Use a descriptive subject line.

Avoid cryptic phrases like "Help" or "For Sale".

Create a fresh message for a new topic.

Do not craft a new message by replying to an existing one and overwriting the subject line.

In the web interface, conversations are grouped into threads. If you reply to a "lost pet" message, clear out all the old text and type info about selling a desk, your "desk" message becomes part of the "lost pet" thread where the conversation is archived.

1) Visit the group page at https://groups.google.com/g/wells-branchneighbors while logged into Google and click ASK TO JOIN GROUP, **OR** 2) Email the moderators at wbneighbors@gmail.com providing name, email address to be subscribed, **and home address**.

Members are not required to have a Google account in order to join. (Use option #2.)

However, if the subscribed email <u>is</u> affiliated with a Google account, the member can log into Google and access the web interface where all conversations are stored. That's the best way to search within old messages.



#### Same Library Card, Two Different Digital Collections

E-Resources are available at Wells Branch Public Library, through our digital collection in both Hoopla and Libby (formerly known as Overdrive). While Libby and Hoopla are similar, each comes with its own pros as well as special features, so each offer something unique to the library. That means no matter how you like to enjoy your content, we've got a service for you.

Using the Libby App as a Wells Branch library card holder can get you access to free ebooks and audiobooks. The Libby app is available for Android, iOS, and Windows devices. If you prefer reading on your Kindle, Libby can send your library books straight to your Kindle. Libby is a simplified app from the previous app called OverDrive for borrowing ebooks and MP3 audiobooks. It has a large selection of ebooks and audiobooks but you may have a await time for the most popular items.

Hoopla is another app where Wells Branch library card holders can Instantly borrow eBooks, audiobooks, along with comics, music, movies & TV - 24/7 and with no wait time. Hoopla has less of a selection of ebooks and audiobooks but all materials are on demand.

Neither app will charge late fees if you forget to return a title. Instead, the title is automatically returned once it reaches its due date. Both apps are completely free to use and the content is free since the accounts are held from libraries. Ads and commercials are also absent from both apps. In order to utilize both apps, you only need a device, a Wifi connection, and a library card.

#### Register to Vote by Mail

It's a new year, which means that if you want to vote by mail in elections this year, it's time to sign up again! It is a requirement to renew your vote by mail registration every year. If you want to vote by mail in the primaries, your application must be received by February 18.

#### Who Can Vote By Mail?

According to the Texas State Law, you may vote early by-mail if you are registered to vote and meet one of the following criteria:

- 65 years of age or older on Election Day
- Sick or disabled
- Expected to give birth within three weeks before or after Election Day
- Away from the county of residence on Election Day and during the early voting period
- Confined in jail, but eligible to vote

However, only applicants who are 65 years of age or older or are disabled qualify to apply for the Annual Application for Ballot By Mail (ABBM). Applying annually ensures that qualified voters will receive a mail ballot for ALL elections held during a calendar year. Annual applications may be submitted starting January 1 but must not be submitted later than the 11<sup>th</sup> day before the first election in which you seek to request a ballot by mail.

If you live in Williamson County, download and print your application to vote by mail at:

#### Here are some tips when filling out the Annual Application for Ballot By Mail:

- Make sure you are registered to vote in the county you are applying to vote by mail in.
- You will need to provide you Texas Driver's License Number, Texas Personal ID Number, or your Election Identification Certificate Number all of which are issued by the Department of Public Safety. If you do not have any of these numbers, you must provide the last four digits of your Social Security Number.
- If you do not remember what number is linked to your voter registration, it is best to provide your Driver's License or ID Number **AND** the last for digits of your SSN.
- Make sure to indicate in Box 4 of the application that you are applying for the "Annual Application". This will ensure that you get a ballot for every election this year.
- Take a photo of your signature on your application, so you will know how to sign you ballot envelopes in a similar way.
- Track your Application for Ballot By Mail and your ballots via the Secretary of State's website.
