

Sept. 23: Early sales begin at the WBNA *Arts at the Library* event



Summer Fun is Always Free at the Library!

Every summer, the Wells Branch Community Library has special programming and reading incentives in addition to all of our regular storytimes, activities, and services. Summer Reading runs from June 1 to July 31 this year. Ages 0-110 can track their reading (on paper or digitally at wblibrary.beanstack.com) for prizes.

We also will have Family Game Nights every Tuesday at 6pm for any age and skill level to play together. This is not the same as our ongoing Monday evening Open Table D&D.

Special programs for ages 8-12 this summer include Adventure Club on Mondays at 4pm and Big Kid Crafts on Fridays at 2pm. We are offering two STEAM building groups on Tuesday afternoons, Block Party at 4pm for ages 5-10 and STEAM Lab at 5pm for ages 8-12.

LAB Rats is a first experience in our (usually adults only) crafting space. Participants must be 10-17 years old to register and attend. Make a messenger bag with sewing machines, use the Cricut to design an iron-on that can be put on that bag or something else, learn to make jewelry with Viking Wire Weaving, and decorate wood with stencils and pyrography. These programs will include all supplies and instruction.

There is <u>no cost or residency requirement</u> to get a library card at Wells Branch Community Library or to attend any of our programs. I recently finished *The Marriage Portrait* by Maggie O'Farrell and haven't been able to stop thinking about it! Set in Florence, Italy in the 1550s, this novel follows the duchess Lucrezia de' Medici from birth through adolescence. Filled with plot twists, historical details, and emotion this is the perfect read for anyone who loves historical fiction, Italian history, or simply a strong, fearless female lead character. — *Morgan Simon, Friends of the Library Board Vice President*

I recommend *Kingdom of the Wicked* series by Kerri Maniscalco for romance and fantasy lovers, with a lot of mythology. In 19th century Italy, Emilia is a witch living in Sicily and working at her family's restaurant. When her twin sister is brutally murdered, Emilia tries to summon a demon to help her get revenge. Instead, she ends up accidentally summoning the Prince of Wrath. These longtime mortal enemies team up to solve the murder. Very satisfying enemies to lovers arc. — *Kaitlyn, Youth Services Assistant Manager*

A Gentleman in Moscow by Amor Towles, tells the story of a Russian Count in the 1920's who is ordered to spend the rest of his life inside the world renowned Metropol Hotel in Moscow instead of being shot! He manages to live a life of purpose while all the while being charming and a true gentleman to all. There are also a few surprising twists that keep things interesting. I read the book, and liked it so much, I also listened to it, which I would recommend, because his charm is even more evident. Those of you who have already read **A Gentleman in Moscow**, might want to give it another read, because it is soon to be a Showtime series starring Ewan McGregor as the Count. — Joan Mead, Friends of the Library Board Member

I recommend *A Deadly Education* by Naomi Novik. Outside the Scholomance is even more dangerous for the young wizards. El is trapped inside the school with her classmates where only some of the ravenous monsters can get at them, and only some of the other students are trying to drain each other for power. It's nice and horrible in the skyless void. All El has to do is not die and not destroy the world. — *Julia, Library Assistant*

For the **Wine, Women and Words Book Club***, I recently read **The Invisible Life of Addie LaRue** by V.E.Schwab. A young woman in medieval times inadvertently calls an old god of the night instead of the day to save her from an unwanted marriage. As often happens, the wish granted is really a curse - to never be remembered after other people look away, and to live forever, until she is willing to give her soul to the god. It alternates between 2014 and the preceding centuries, and is a very interesting read.

Possums: Friend or Foe?

Maybe you find them lovable, or maybe their pointy ears and toothy smirks churn your stomach. Either way, you'll never need to worry about possums attacking your pets, digging in your garden or threatening your children—these small, nomadic marsupials are perfectly innocuous. Possums are an integral part of the parkland system.

Here are a few points on possums:

- •Call 311 if you have concern about an injured or sick animal. The wildlife rescue team will not accept, rescue or relocate a healthy animal.
- •Possums are considered a "friend" and help with pest control, feeding on insects, ticks, snakes and small vermin.
- •Possums very rarely get rabies, due to a low body temperature.
- •This marsupial is not likely to prey on cats, dogs or other furry friends.

If threatened, a possum may hiss, drool, bare its teeth and play dead; none of this is a sign of rabies, it just ruse to avoid predators.

To close, having a possum wander through your yard or the park system is considered a "good friend" within the Wells Branch urban eco system.

Community Wildlife Habitat - Coming Soon!

Rapid and large-scale changes to our lands and waters mean wildlife are losing the habitats they once knew. More than half of America's wetlands that support waterfowl and wildlife have been drained and/or plowed. Habitat fragmentation reduces biodiversity by 13 to 75%. To combat fragmentation, Wells Branch is partnering with the National Wildlife Federation to become a Certified Community Wildlife Habitat. Every habitat garden is a step toward replenishing resources for wildlife such as bees, butterflies, birds, and amphibians—both locally and along migratory corridors. To secure certification. Wells Branch would need at least 175 homes with the Wildlife Habitat certification. The basic requirements for the certification are to provide food, water, cover, and a place for wildlife to raise young, and to engage in sustainable gardening and landscaping practices. Examples of food are as simple as having a bird feeder and plants that provide pollen and nectar. Similarly, a birdbath, roosting box, and a rock pile are sufficient to meet the water and cover requirements. Mature trees and host plants for caterpillars meet the places to raise young requirements. The use of compost and native plants in your landscape fulfills the sustainable practices requirement. If you are interested in this program, I will be presenting at the July meeting of the Wells Branch Garden Guild (Saturday, July 15, 10am at the Recreation Center on Shoreline Drive). 
The Garden Guild is a friendly group of neighbors who meet once a month to discuss all things gardening. Topics will vary each month. All are welcome!



Over the past 10 years, volunteers have planted over 130 trees during It's My Park Day events at the WB Disc Golf Course!


