Hop into Spring! Join your friends, neighbors and The Easter Bunny himself, at the annual Wells Branch Easter Egg Hunt. The "Hunts" will be by age group and begin at 10:30am SHARP! Plan to come early and visit with the Easter Bunny or have fun at our craft table. This is a community event and ALL Wells Branch residents and their invited guests are welcome.

We need parents to set the example for behavior during this event. Please read and go over the rules with your hunters! **ONE** parent will be allowed in to help with the two youngest age groups (0-18mos & 18mos-3yrs.) We ask that you respect this restriction. Children in all other age groups must hunt on their own. There will be 7 minutes between each of the age groups to allow parents with multiple children to navigate to the next area. Please, only allow your children to hunt with their respective age group. If for some reason, your child ends up with only a few eggs, please approach any of our WBNA volunteers in bunny ears, they will have extra goodies. Last, but not least, please remember that this event is put on by volunteers. We spend weeks getting ready and usually stuff 8,000-10,000 eggs (if you are wondering, yes we recycle those eggs.) It's no small feat. So, if a volunteer asks something of you, please be respectful of their requests.

We love our neighbors and our community. We're asking for everyone's help in advance in creating an enjoyable experience for all involved. **Please help us and remember to recycle your eggs before you leave**. *We need volunteers to help things run more smoothly.* Anyone whose kids have aged out of the hunt, community service groups, or older teens who need service hours, we would be so appreciative of your time!

Shirley Lukenbill 1940-2024

Remembering Her Life of Service and Compassion

It is with heavy hearts that we bid farewell to a profoundly important former member of our Wells Branch Elementary family. Shirley Lukenbill, or Mrs. Lukie, as she was so affectionatly called, was an icon at WBE for many years. Many of our children were blessed and inspired not only by her love for books and reading, but also for love of animals and the many rescue animals that called the WBE Library home. Mrs. Lukie passed away peacefully surrounded by her family on February 25th, 2024, at the age of 84. Mrs. Lukie's life was one filled with love, dedication, and a passion for making the world a better place for both humans and animals alike.

Mrs. Lukie's passion for education and literature was evident throughout her career. From nurturing young minds as she set up and managed the North Shore High School Library in Galena Park, Texas, to the University of Louisiana, where she imparted her knowledge and wisdom to aspiring to aspiring librarians until 1968. She then began a new chapter in her life when she married Bill Lukenbill. Together, they embarked on a journey that brought them to Austin as they both taught in the Graduate School of



Library Science, which is now the School of Information at the University of TX at Austin. Simultaneously, Shirley worked as the school librarian at Wells Branch Elementary. She wasn't just the Keeper of the Books, she loved our students and families and wanted them to appreciate and know the importance of reading and love it as much as she did! Additionally, she was just as passionate about the animals that also share our world. Mrs. Lukie's love for animals was on full display (along with many of her animals who called the library home) while she was at WBE, as she was a volunteer with Austin Wildlife Rescue for 15 years. She cared for many orphaned wild animals, including rabbits, opossums, squirrels, raccoons, songbirds, and owls. It was such a great experience for the families that were able to take home and care for one of the animals over weekends and holiday breaks-talk about hands on learning! Mrs. Lukie loved watching the students grow up and it was a treat for both student and professor when a WBE student or parent enrolled in her Children's Literature class at UT! Mrs. Lukie retired from Wells Branch Elementary in 2004, a huge loss to the students and families.

Mrs. Lukie touched thousands of lives (both human and non-human) in her decades of working with the children, college students, trash pandas, nighthawks, screech owls, and squirrels of the central Texas area. The libraries and the forests aroundcentral Texas would have been quieter without her influence on generations of kids and critters. She will be remembered and missed for these contributions.

A memorial open house in honor of Mrs. Lukie's life will be held at the Cedar Park Public Library Community Room, 550 Discovery Blvd, Cedar Park, TX 78613 on Saturday, April 13, from 2:30-4:30pm. 

Get Your Emergency Preparation Supplies Sales Tax Free April 27-29

Natural disasters will continue to happen. Prepare yourself, stock or re-stock during the 2024 Sales Tax Holiday just for these supplies. There is no limit on the number of qualifying items you can purchase.

This year's holiday begins at 12:01 a.m. on Saturday, April 27, and ends at midnight on Monday, April 29. These emergency preparation supplies qualify for tax exemption:

Less than \$3000

• Portable generators

Less than \$300

- Emergency ladders
- Hurricane shutters

Less than \$75

- Axes and/or Hatchets
- Batteries, (AAA, AA, C, D, 6 or 9 volt)
- Can openers non-electric
- Carbon monoxide detectors
- Coolers and ice chests for food storage non-electric
- Fire extinguishers

- First aid kits
- Fuel containers
- Ground anchor systems and tie-down kits
- Ice products reusable and artificial
- Light sources portable self-powered (including battery operated). Examples of items include: candles, flashlights and lanterns
- Mobile telephone batteries and mobile telephone chargers
- Radios portable self-powered (including battery operated) includes two-way and weather band radios
- Smoke detectors
- Tarps and other plastic sheeting

Bulk Trash

Metal Recycling

Lawn mowers (oil & gas emptied) • Metal tools, sheets, rods and framing • All appliances (Freon must be removed) • Water heaters • Aluminum

Household Waste & E-Cycling

Creams, liquids, ointments and pet medication will <u>NOT</u> be accepted. Please remove labels with personal information prior to drop-off.

On-Site Shredding

Carbon paper, colored paper, computer paper, fax paper, transparencies, post-it notes, window envelopes, glossy paper, invoice paper, laser print-outs, ledger paper, letterhead, stationary, NCR paper

WB Wild Tip – Getting a Spring Garden in the Ground Quickly

It's spring and perhaps you have started collecting plants like I do; I tell my family that they just follow me home! Maybe you need to pull up some turf grass and build out a garden area to get those plants in the ground.

The following is a process you can use to get that done quickly, with minimal labor and without chemicals, in a way that should limit weeds and grass from encroaching on the garden in the future. Use this for landscape gardens, not food.

First, plan out your garden, the size, shape, and place, choose drought tolerant native plants from the City of Austin Grow Green Guide based on sun/shade and size of the area. Using rock or brick edging with some width to it is helpful in keeping other grass out of the garden, dig the edging into the soil at least an inch.

Paint the shape of the garden on the ground, using a weed eater, whack all of the unwanted vegetation down to the roots. Leave the cuttings and cover all of the garden area with clean cardboard, overlapping the edges.

Next, water the cardboard until it's thoroughly damp. Cover the cardboard with about 6 inches or more of well-draining soil, being careful not to pile up soil around the base of any trees. If you use anything larger than a one-gallon size plant, you will likely have to cut a hole in the cardboard and dig into the original soil so that the plant will fit. The cardboard can break down within three months if it's kept damp and you should have a good start on a successful, grass free garden.

Taking these steps in setting up your garden should limit the amount of labor needed to maintain it in the future.

Note: Cardboard from recycled paper will break down more quickly than corrugated board and that's a good thing. Here are a couple of recommended resources:





People who spend time outdoors have surely noticed butterflies, especially in Texas where there are over 400 species, including Monarchs that migrate in large numbers during spring and fall. But even people with keen natural interests often overlook a related and even more numerous winged insect - the moth. Moths are important to Texas ecosystems as bird and bat food as well as pollinators. Moths also are seen in a wide range of interesting shapes and color patterns, which make them fun to watch. This presentation will serve as an introduction to the variety of Texas moths, including those that might be seen in the Greater Austin region. Property Appraisal Notices Coming Soon Pam Wachholz, REALTOR-GRI, SRES, ABR, MRP, PSA, RENE, NHC, AHWD

Like 'em or hate 'em (I think I know how MOST of us feel!) the Notice of Appraised Value for your property should arrive around mid-April. There are a few things to keep in mind as you review your notice:

1-This notice is not your tax bill This is the notice of the value showing what the CAD (County Appraisal District) thinks your property is worth from a Market Value standpoint. You do have the opportunity to protest the value!

2-There are TWO values listed. The first is MARKET VALUE - that is what the CAD believes your property is worth, without taking into consideration the Homestead Cap. The second is the ASSESSED VALUE - this is what your tax bill will be based on and, if you've had the Homestead exemption for several years, it will likely be lower than the Market Value. The Homestead exemption gives you a nice break on the taxable value for certain entities (including PfISD or RRISD). BUT, just as important is the "CAP" on value – especially after the "COVID Craziness" that drove property prices through the roof in 2021/22. The CAD can only increase your Assessed Value by a maximum of 10% from the previous year. IE: a \$300k assessed value last year means the max assessed value this year would be \$330k, the maximum due to the Homestead Cap.

3-If you're going to protest your value (\$275k value on our lots-really?) you must decide at the beginning if you will hire someone to do it or go through the process yourself. Once you're on one path, you cannot switch.

Protesting your Market Value, even if your assessed value is lower, is a good idea and should be considered - the explanation is longer than the available space, so I will cover it in the next issue!
