

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Want to Help Neighbors in Need? Volunteers and Donations are **ALWAYS** needed!

St. Andrew's Food Pantry and Homeless Outreach serve our local neighbors in need at 14311 Wells Port Drive.

Every Thursday night, volunteers serve a hot meal to over 50 people experiencing homelessness. The homeless are also offered a chance to take a shower, do laundry, and pick up donated items. The most requested donations are:

Small tarps and blankets (5'x7' max) for weather protection and

New or pre-owned clothing: Belts, jeans (waist 32-36), shorts, sneakers, and t-shirts (M-XXL).

Hygiene products in small bottles: soap, shampoo, toothpaste, toothbrushes, combs, deodorant.

New clothing: socks, men's boxer briefs (M-XL), and women's underwear and sports bras (L-XL)

St. Andrew's Food Pantry serves 220+ households experiencing food insecurity on the 2nd and 4th Saturdays of the month from 9am to noon. The Food Pantry is always in need of volunteers – especially Spanish speakers, computer-savvy volunteers for registration, and volunteer shopping assistants who can stand for 2 hours. Email Food-Pantry@staopen.org to sign up to volunteer.

The Food Pantry is currently requesting donations of:

Canned/dry, non-perishable, unexpired food items like beans, rice, tuna, pasta, pasta sauce, cooking oil, peanut butter, canned fruit/vegetables, and baby food/formula.

Diapers, pullups, and period pads (opened packages are accepted). **Baby-related items** like wipes, bottles, bibs, and diaper rash cream. Bags: Clean and flattened plastic, paper, or canvas bags with handles.

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Library Renovation- Coming this fall!

The Wells Branch Community Library is very excited to remodel our lovely building so we can grow alongside this amazing community. We have been working on plans, saving our pennies, and gathering community input since 2019!

The first big step is to replace the stacks with shelving on casters. This will make it possible to keep the collection available throughout the construction phases. We hope to install the new shelves between Summer Reading and Labor Day. While that happens, the library itself will be closed to browsing, but programs will continue and you can still borrow materials using the reserve system in the catalog (just like we did when we were closed for the pandemic).

True construction is scheduled to begin in October. Phase 1 will last about four months and focuses on connecting the main library to the meeting room building. Highlights of Phase 1 are enclosing the breezeway to create a lobby, expanding the large meeting room to accommodate more people at programs, reworking the bathrooms on that side, updating the finishes and fixtures in that building, and adding a large storage closet.

The library itself will still be open during this phase and programs will continue. Since we will not have access to the meeting rooms, we will all need to be creative and flexible about our space. Christine Bloemsma recommends: Telephone of the Tree by Alison McGhee

Ayla and Kiri have been friends since birth. Their friendship connects them to each other and to all the trees of the neighborhood. They care for the trees, play in them, and listen as the trees wave and speak.

Now Kiri is far away, unreachable. One day, a mysterious rotary phone appears in the crook of Ayla's special tree. At first, Ayla ignores the phone, but after she invents a magical purpose for it in conversation with a pizza delivery person, she sees its power to heal and help people find peace.

This book hits hard. It contains the beauty and bitterness of grief and memory. Be careful of reading it in public—there's a true risk of snotty bawling.

Joan Mead, FOL Vice President recommends: Remarkably Bright Creatures by Shelby Van Pelt

The story follows Tova, a widow and nighttime janitor at an aquarium, who forms an unexpected friendship with an octopus who helps her uncover clues about the years-long disappearance of her son.

If you've enjoyed videos and documentaries about how smart octopuses are, you'll especially enjoy this book and more easily be able to "suspend your disbelief." It's a totally original mystery packed with memorable characters that I cared about.

One plus to listening to the audiobook is that I got to hear the octopus speak in a very formal, condescending manner!

Happy Trails: Keep it Fun, Friendly and Clean (Courtesy of Wells Branch MUD)

The District is home to a network of trails that wind through our parks, green spaces, and facilities, connecting the neighborhood from top to bottom. Whether you are walking the dog, playing with the family, or simply enjoying nature, maintaining a peaceful space involves work at every level. To maintain the trails' integrity, you can play a big part in keeping them safe, enjoyable, and clean.

Cycle Smart. If you are biking, adjust your speed to match the flow of trail traffic. Another cyclist, a jogger, or wildlife could be waiting around the corner.

Keep Right, Pass Left. Similar to when you are traveling on a roadway, a general rule of thumb is for slower users to stay toward the right, and faster users to pass on the left. Make sure to signify when passing by giving a heads-up or ringing your bike bell.

Step Aside to Stop. Whether you are taking a break or chatting with a neighbor, be sure to step off to the side of the trail so others can keep moving without having to weave around you.

Paw Patrol. Keep your furry friends close and under control. Dogs must remain on-leash at all times to ensure easy management of their behavior. Remember the golden rule of pet ownership—Do your Doo-ty and Scoop the Poop. Picking up after your dog keeps the trails and creeks clean, stops the spread of pests and diseases, and prevents any messy accidents from happening.

Stay Aware. A long walk is often made more enjoyable by listening to music, speaking with your walking buddy, or listening to nature around you. Have fun on your walk, but stay aware of your surroundings. Knowing who has the right of way and being cognizant of your surroundings helps prevent trail mishaps.

Respect the Rules. A few simple rules help keep our trails clean and safe. Pick up after yourself (and your pup), follow park hours (5am–10pm), and most importantly—enjoy the beauty of nature along the way.

How is Wells Branch Wild Conservancy helping to connect kids to nature?

First, we are adding more activities for children. You may have attended the recent PUMA (Purple Martin) presentation where kids (and adults!) could see the North Meadow purple martin gourds lowered, and the nests and babies admired. Coming Up: On June 14, our monthly meeting is a special treat for kids and adults alike! Niki Lake, Texas Turtle Expert, will be at the dock at Mills Pond with live turtles and an interactive presentation all about turtles. Learn about the turtles that call Wells Branch home and interact with turtle ambassadors from the San Marcos Discovery Center. Activities include show and tell about turtle anatomy, turtle ethics, turtle natural history, eastern box turtle and red-eared slider interaction/feeding. The presentation will be held from 10:30-11:30.

Next, we are finding out from Wells Branch parents what is important to them and their families. We are planning a parent focus group for a one-time discussion and idea-sharing.
