Own Pets? Be a good Neighbor by Being a Responsible Pet Owner

Pets can bring so much love and joy to their humans' lives. I cannot imagine NOT having a fur-baby in my home and Wells Branch is home to many, many pets.

Owning a pet is a give and take relationship – they give us love and in return, we are supposed to give them love and the necessities for living a happy, healthy life. As pet owners in a neighborhood, we also have an obligation to our neighbors to not let our pets cause damage or encroach on the peace and enjoyment of ones' property. Pet owners also have a responsibility to their pets and neighbors to ensure that if pets get lost—they can easily be identified so they can be returned (it's heartbreaking to find a sweet pup on the loose and not be able to find its owner and have no choice but to take it to the shelter). So, here are a few tips and resources so you and your pets can be Good Neighbors!

1-Spay & neuter your pets! Even indoor dogs and cats can give owners the slip and roam around – don't risk an unwanted pregnancy – there are already too many abandoned animals that have shelters and fosters at full capacity. And outdoor cat owners, keep in mind that if you have multiple unsterilized cats, there WILL BE BABIES. Outside cats & kittens ARE coyote food. It is nothing short of cruel to have unsterilized cats running around outside when it is well-known there are active coyotes in the area—some that have been seen jumping privacy fences and killing beloved pets.

Luckily, Travis County makes it super easy to take care of this issue by offering their FREE Spay/Neuter Clinic in July. See page 12 for details.

2-Get your pets microchipped! Free Microchipping & tags are available to Travis County residents at the Austin Animal Center in Austin – call for details 512-974-2000. But, the micro-chip is basically useless if the chip isn't registered and kept up to date, register your chip! Registration is free online at https:// www.freepetchipregistry.com/ and it is free for the life of your pet. If you used www.foundanimals.org in the past, it was bought by my24pet.com and all registrations were supposedly transferred. Remember, a registered microchip is your best friend when it comes to protecting your best friend! Collars can and do fall off, and pets can travel or be transported (and are) outside the area where they were lost, making it virtually impossible to reunite a lost pet - UNLESS they are chipped. Help yourself, help your pet, and help the good Samaritans and volunteers out who find your pet. And to help our neighbors, the WBNA owns a microchip reader that has helped reunite many pets with their owners over the years. If you find a lost pet, TEXT 512-270-1026 to be connected to the volunteer with the reader. This is a volunteer program, so please be patient! You can also take the lost animal to PetsMart or any Fire Station to check for a chip.

3-Pick up your dog's poop! When walking your dog, be sure you have at least one waste bag with you. There are very inexpensive waste bag holders that attach to the leash and make it easy to use, or, just tie a few bags to your pets leash.



4-Keep your pets' immunizations up-to-date. If money is an issue, EmanciPet has options and there is a new group that offers clinics nearby – go to lowcostpetvaccinations.net and choose the Austin area. As of this writing, their website shows a clinic in Pflugervile and they advertise that clinics are held "near you every weekend". Not immunizing your animals puts not only your pet, but other people and pets at risk!

5-If your outdoor pets are encroaching onto your neighbors' property and leaving visible waste, smells or damage – the neighborly and considerate thing to do is for you to find a solution to the problem. WB neighbors are having issues in several areas with outdoor cats who pee at the neighbors front & back doors and/or in their flower beds. I am a cat owner – cat pee SMELLS BAD. And in my profession, when someone goes to sell their home with that smell, they will have a really hard time selling unless they get rid of the smell, completely. So please, if your neighbor comes to you because your outdoor pets are coming on their property and wreaking havoc – keep your pets inside or in your yard, and offer to help fix/resolve whatever issues your pets have caused.

6-DON'T DUMP YOUR PET! Not only is it cruel, it is also illegal. If circumstances become such that you are no longer able to care for your pet, please search for a foster or rescue organization. Reach out on the WBNA FB page and ask if anyone knows anyone who is looking for a pet, or knows of any fosters or other resources. Dumping a housepet is scary and your pet is vulnerable to traffic, bad weather, lack of food & water as well as becoming the next meal for one of the many coyotes that call WB home. Be wary about posting your pet on public sights like Craigslist & NextDoor without thoroughly vetting potential adopters and charging a re-homing fee. Unfortunately, dog-fighting rings still exist and those criminals are always looking for free or cheap dogs & cats to use as bait animals. It is cruel and inhumane. Facebook offers several re-homing group sites for our area.

The Texas Humane Network is a fantastic resource for anyone who owns or is considering adopting a pet. If you are considering re-homing your fur-baby, please check out the resources on their site: texashumanenetwork.org/animal-topics/. There are tons of relevant topics for pet owners, and near the bottom of the page is a block with great information (including how to vet a potential adopter) if you are considering re-homing or surrendering your pet.

7-DON'T LEAVE YOUR PET IN THE CAR!!!! Summertime in TX is HOT and temperatures rise quickly inside of a car — even a car with cracked windows. **HEAT KILLS**—So, please don't do it. Leave your pet at home, or take it in wherever you are going. If not, don't be surprised if you come out to a broken window and your pet is missing because a good Samaritan rescued it. And remember, leaving a pet in a car in extreme temperatures, without adequate food or water, or with the engine off and climate control not engaged can be considered animal cruelty, leading to fines and potential jail time.

Wells Branch is an amazing place to live for both people and pets. Let's be considerate, good neighbors and keep it that way!

Jennifer Klein, Treasurer, WBCL Board of Trustees recommends: The Nightingale by Kristin Hannah

The Nightingale is always one of my top book recommendations and stands out as my favorite World War II novel... but have your Kleenex box ready! I was crying over my breakfast coffee trying to get through the ending.

The novel takes place in Nazi-occupied France and focuses on the experiences of two sisters, Vianne and Isabelle Mauriac. Isabelle joins the French Resistance and risks her life countless times to save the lives of others. After Vianne's husband is sent to the front lines, Vianne is forced to house a Nazi officer in her home while trying to provide for and protect herself and her daughter. The novel highlights the experiences, contributions, and resilience of women, a common theme in Kristin Hannah's novels. If you enjoy this one, you may also enjoy The Women about Vietnam War nurses or The Four Winds about the Great Depression. All of these books are available in hard copy, ebook, and audiobook from the Library.

Matt Bucher, Secretary, WBCL Board of Trustees recommends: Starman After Midnight by Scott Semegran

This wonderfully engaging and hilarious novel is set in a familiar suburb of Austin and tells the story of two neighbors looking to solve a mystery. Although the two neighbors don't share the same political views, they both enjoy sitting in the backyard, swapping stories, and drinking beer. But, when neighbors' pets start disappearing, one of the neighbors suggests they install security cameras to find out what's happening. The neighborhood gossip really ramps up when they catch a glimpse of a very strange person on camera. The unlikely duo try several unconventional methods to catch the culprit, much to the chagrin of local message boards. Semegran's storytelling is simply delightful as he paints a vivid picture of a strange Texas suburb.

Bring Wildlife Home – With the Help of a Tree!

Did you know that one of the best things about living in Wells Branch is already growing right in your yard? Our neighborhood, founded in the 1980s, is full of beautiful mature trees like native oaks, hackberries, cottonwoods, redbuds, and sycamores. These trees do more than just look great—they're the foundation of healthy local wildlife habitats.

If you're thinking about certifying your yard as a wildlife habitat, having a mature tree gives you a major head start! To become certified, your space needs to provide four key things for wildlife: food, water, shelter (cover), and a place to raise young. Mature trees can check several of those boxes on their own.

Depending on the species, trees provide nectar, pollen, seeds, nuts, cones, berries, or fruit. Even their fallen leaves and twigs help feed all sorts of creatures. They also offer safe places to nest and raise young—perfect for birds, insects, reptiles, and mammals. And during bad weather or when predators are nearby, trees offer the cover animals need to stay safe.

If you already have a big, beautiful tree in your yard, you may only need to add a water source and adopt a few eco-friendly practices to get certified. If you don't have a tree yet, fall is the perfect time to plant one. Choosing a native tree is best—it will thrive in our Central Texas climate and support local wildlife, starting with insects and extending all the way up the food web to birds and beyond.

Want to learn more about how to turn your yard into a certified wildlife haven? Join us! The Wells Branch Wild Conservancy is hosting an info session on Saturday, July 12th at 9 a.m. at the Wells Branch Recreation Center.

Invasive Species Removal Event

– Volunteers Needed!

A parasitic invader has taken root in our wildflower meadows near St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, and we need your help to stop it!

The culprit? **Dodder**—a yellow-orange vine that looks like Silly String gone rogue. It wraps around native plants, sucking the life out of them. It's easy to spot, but it takes teamwork to remove. We clip the host plant just below the infestation, collect everything (dodder and host) in plastic bags, and toss them in the trash—no composting allowed.

The infested area includes land owned by both the church and the Wells Branch MUD. We've started working with members of St. Andrew's, and now we're calling on our community to pitch in.

Join Us in the Field!

Our first mission targets the field between St. Andrew's parking lot and the nearby neighborhood. We'll move slowly across the area, scanning for dodder and removing it as we go.

Volunteer Times: (Choose What Works for You):

Mornings: (to beat the heat): 8-10am on the 1st & 3rd Saturdays (July 5, July 19, August 1, August 15)

Evenings: Tuesdays from 7pm until dusk, starting June 24

Parking: Use the St. Andrew's lot and park near the field.

What to Bring:

Garden shears (for your personal use) A 5-gallon bucket (perfect for hauling infested plants)

Once we get dodder under control, we'll tackle other invasives like Johnson grass, KR bluestem, and hedge parsley (a.k.a. the dreaded sock shredder!).



- You will remain in your car throughout the process from registration, to drop off and pickup.
- All patients will be registered on a first-come, first-served basis. Participants must be residents of the City of Austin or Travis County.
- All pets must be at least 2 lbs and 2 months old.
- Cats must be in secure carriers or traps with a usable door. Only one cat is allowed per carrier.
- Please alert staff at the time of drop-off if the pet is known to be currently nursing.
- We will provide pick-up information at the time of drop-off and written discharge instructions when your pet is discharged.



If your pet has been vaccinated in the last year, please bring proof.

Frequently asked questions:

Do you have to reside in Travis County? Will there be a verification/proof of county residency?

Yes, as a tax funded, municipal shelter residential boundaries apply. Please bring an ID or piece of mail with your name and current address to verify county residency.

How many animals are you allowed to bring?

There is no limit on animals per car. Registration will stop once the schedule is filled each morning.

Are feral cats ok to bring in if the cats are in a permitted cat trap and covered?

We encourage people to trap and bring free roaming cats to be sterilized. They must be in a humane trap and covered. The cats will be scanned for a microchip before surgery is performed. If you want to keep your trap cover, please let the check in team know so they can swap for a different cover, as they tend to get lost in this process.

Is the clinic for all five days?

Yes, the clinic surgery days will be on July 28th, 29th, 30th, 31st and August 1st. If it fills up, return earlier the next day to receive the service.
