



Support your local Food Pantry and Homeless Outreach

St. Andrew's Food Pantry and Homeless Outreach serve our local neighbors in need at the corner of Wells Port Drive and Wells Branch Parkway.

On November 8, the Food Pantry provided fresh produce, bread, milk, canned/non-perishable food items, diapers, and period products to 300 households – a new record. Our upcoming food pantries are on Nov. 22 and Dec. 13 from 9am to noon. To prepare for larger numbers and the Holidays, the Food Pantry is requesting donations of:

- Canned/dry, non-perishable, unexpired food items like beans, rice, tuna, pasta, pasta sauce, cooking oil, peanut butter, canned fruit/ vegetables, and baby food/formula.
- Diapers, pullups, period pads, and tampons (opened packages are accepted).
- Plastic, paper, or canvas bags.

St. Andrew's Thursday Night Homeless Outreach:

Every Thursday night, volunteers serve a hot meal to over 50 people experiencing homelessness. The homeless are also offered a chance to take a shower, do laundry, and pick up donated items. When temperatures fall below freezing, St. Andrew's serves as a Cold Weather Shelter for the homeless and will need additional volunteers, meals, and donations to support this important community service. Donations needed:



- wishlist Winter Clothing: New/used thermal undershirts/
 underwear, coats, gloves, hats, scarfs, etc.
 - Meals for a group of 50+
 - Sneakers and Socks: New/used for both men and women.
 - Used Clothing: T-Shirts and sweatshirts (M-XXL), belts and jeans (waist 32-36)



- New underwear: Men's combination boxer briefs (M-XL) and women's underwear and sports bras (L-XL)
- \bullet Small tarps and blankets (5'x7' max) for weather protection and groundcover.
- Hygiene products in small bottles: soap, shampoo, toothpaste, toothbrushes, combs, deodorant. Small sizes preferred.

Celebrating Community, Conservation, and Native Beauty

CONSERVANCY At the end of October, Wells
Branch Wild Conservancy hosted its

annual **Community Celebration**—and what a joyful gathering it was!

We were proud to present the 2025 Steward Honor to the Austin Chapter of the Native Plant Society of Texas (NPSOT). This award recognizes the chapter's outstanding efforts in promoting native plant use and conservation across Central Texas, and their continued support of our mission to protect and enhance local ecosystems.



Notably, NPSOT sponsored our 2025 plant sale, helping us distribute **800 native plants** to the Wells Branch community! **Julia Weatherby, President of the Austin Chapter, accepted the award on behalf of NPSOT.**

We also celebrated a major milestone: **63 new wildlife habitats certified this past year**, bringing our total to **169 certified properties** in Wells Branch! We're well on our way to reaching our goal of **200 certified habitats by 2026**. Interested in joining the movement? Visit www.nwf.org/certify to learn how to certify your property.

Another highlight of the celebration was the unveiling of our new logo, featuring the leaf of the cedar elm (Ulmus crassifolia)—a tree that's as native as it is beautiful. Cedar elms are hardy, drought-tolerant shade trees that thrive in our local soil. You'll spot them throughout Wells Branch, especially their young branches with quirky corky "wings." In fall, their small leaves turn a brilliant yellow and compost naturally, enriching the soil and providing shelter and food for wildlife year-round. Fun fact: Mourning Cloak and Question Mark butterflies rely on cedar elm as a larval host! And speaking of leaves—did you know the oxygen levels in our atmosphere actually dip in winter when trees shed their leaves? It's a fascinating reminder of how vital our urban forest is to the health of our environment.

Thank you to everyone who joined us in celebrating nature, community, and conservation. Together, we're making Wells Branch wilder—and better—every year!
